How Are Scholarship Recipients Chosen?

The Hornell High School Alumni tradition strives to encourage and support life-styles that have strong work ethics, public service and academic achievement by rewarding students who exemplify these characteristics with recognition and financial assistance for their education.

A silent committee serves at the pleasure of the President of the Alumni Board. This group is always kept confidential. It may come as a surprise, but this is truly a secret committee and never discussed. Board members don't have a clue! A meeting is called by the Superintendent of Schools and the President of the Alumni Board.

The Silent Committee, school officials, teachers and guidance counselors meet for the first time. Every senior is offered an opportunity to fill out an application. The Superintendent provides a detailed resume of all students: student class ranking, financial need, student activities, desire for higher education (school choice), cost, student character, personality, and potential leadership.

All selections are final. No records leave the school, and resumes of the students are returned and kept confidential.


This is a photo of the old Erie Freight House (1905). It is now the location of Transit Drive, the road that takes you to the Alstom facility.


Dear Sally,







Horey has been a doctor for more than thirty-five years and has an extensive list of notable achievements from his years in his medical profession, as well as years of political involvement. He worked as the New York State Assistant Commissioner of Economic Development and was recognized for his relief efforts following the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks. He also served five years as the Director of Geriatrics for the Bath VA Medical Center. While working there, he mentioned he was most proud of his visit to Waco, Texas to help treat Hurricane Katrina victims. In a prepared statement, Horey concluded, "It is good to be back among friends. I grew up in Hornell, started my career here, and it seems fitting to end it working at St. James Mercy Hospital."

Hornell Native Heads Security Detachment at Democratic National Convention

Mike Dailey, an HHS graduate of the class of 1975, moved to Aurora, Colorado and became a Police Lieutenant. During the 2008 Democratic Convention, Dailey was in charge of a sixty-man SWAT team responsible for controlling crowds in downtown Denver. There were a few radical organizations that got out of hand and resulted in Dailey & his crew arresting over 100 protesters. Dailey later said that he was very proud of the officers under his command. They did a great job.

Hornell's New Fire Captain

Frank Brzozowski graduated from Hornell High School in 1980. He was appointed to the position of fire captain this past July at the Board of Public Safety meeting. Fire Chief Dan Smith '77 gave his own praise for Brzozowski. "He's very dedicated, hardworking, honest, and motivated. I can't think of a guy in the department who deserves it more." Beginning in 1992, Brzozowski became a second-level Fire Investigator, a Paramedic, and leads the Hornell Fire Investigative unit. Many Hornell fire fighters are also trained as medics. Brzozowski says that this makes scheduling more flexible while the training gets harder.

Hornell Quintet Claims Victory

Mike Smith, Dan Schwartz '89, Doug Gilbert, Mike Daniels '81, and Tom Kinney '62 won the 40th Annual Lilac Bowling Tournament at Gates Lanes. The tourney actually began on April 11, 2008 and ended on July 13th with approximately 700 teams participating. These five men scored 3,414 points, only one point higher than their closest competitors from Holland Willow. Over their three games, Kinney contributed 633 points, Smith added in 550 points, Daniels came up with 617, Gilbert had 558, and Schwartz had 573 points. In the future, she plans on visiting New York and the memorial so that she can say goodbye to a friend she never met in person.

Exchange Student Returns to Hornell after a 30-year Hiatus

Jose Ramon Vargas' first lived in Hornell during the 1978-79 school year. He was an exchange student from Columbia. Jose returned to Hornell during the summer of 2008. The two-week trip to the United States involved his first visit to Hornell since being a student at HHS and another visit to Boston, where his wife has family. Jose wanted the chance to catch up with his former host parents, Bernie and Esther McAneney. A recent heart attack made Vargas realize the importance of taking a break from his work as a Worker's Compensation doctor for Liberty Mutual in Giron, Bucaramanga, Columbia. Vargas plans on attending a class reunion in the future.

After several weeks of research, Marseena Harmonson was successful in tracking down the first African-American to graduate from Hornell High School. At the end of her search, she discovered that it was Harold Peterson Gibbs who graduated in 1925. Harmonson found that he was an active participant in many school functions and very wellliked by his classmates. He played on the basketball team, was a member of the school orchestra, and was secretary of his graduating class. Harmonson continued her research and found that after Gibbs graduated, the next two African-American students to receive a diploma from HHS were Helen Evans '30 and Lualma Lankford '31. Harmonson said that she did the research because she thought it was important for current African-American students to be able to know this information. Harmonson also said that she enjoyed doing the research and is looking forward to finding the first black student to graduate from Steuben County.

Hornellian is Proud of Collection

Mike Snowden '68 is the proud owner of over 1,500 presidential campaign memorabilia. He owns some pieces of campaign artifacts that date back to the early 1800's and a few of them are even autographed. Snowden has an entire room in his house dedicated to his memorabilia and has pursued this dream ever since he was a child.

When Snowden was ten years old, he partnered up with his brother to form a neighborhood group they called the "Know Your Presidents Club". From that point on, Snowden was hooked. "We always thought we were going to be President someday, but it didn't work out that way." Some of Snowden's pieces are worth as much as \$4,000 and are classified as museum quality pieces. Snowden finds almost all of his artifacts on eBay, and some in an occasional antique sale. He has various displays of his artifacts around Hornell. He hopes to encourage many young children to pursue a career/hobby in a political and/or presidential campaign.

Hornell Doctor Aids Gaza Strip

Dr. Ismail Mehr '91 travelled to the Gaza Strip this past January to take part in a 10-day mission by the Islamic Medical Association of North America. Mehr had previously travelled to the site of the 2004 tsunami and an earthquake in Pakistan in 2005 to aid people affected by these

"People need to realize there is a humanitarian side to it. The people that are hurting are the civilians and the public," Dr. Mehr stated.

George Huffsmith celebrated his 90th birthday on March 2, 2009 at the Hornell City Hall with Hornell Mayor Shawn Hogan, members of Police and Fire departments, and several city employees. Huffsmith is perhaps the oldest and one of the longest-working Public Safety Commissioners in the State of New York. He was appointed Public Safety Commissioner of the City of Hornell in 1986 by Mayor Shawn Hogan. According to Mayor Shawn Hogan, "George is a man of great character and compassion. He has done so many acts of kindness that they are too numerous to count." Huffsmith served in the Air Force as a crew engineer during World War II for four years. He was the President of the Hornell Little League for fifteen years, and is enshrined in its Hall of Fame. He was also the Chairman of the Salvation Army for forty years and is presently the Vice President of the Rural Hope Cemetery.





DON FORTUNA '87

Don Fortuna played varsity baseball for the Red Raiders for four years. Although he started his freshman year on the junior varsity, he was brought up to the varsity team which is a rare feat for a freshman. As a sophomore in 1985, Don had a .245 batting average. He was 2nd on the team in triples, struck out only eight times in 78 official at bats, and was an outstanding defensive shortstop with only eight errors in 16 games.

As a junior Don, led the team in triples (2), runs scored (19), was 2nd with 17 RBI's, struck out only nine times, and had a .318 batting average. Defensively, he had only four errors at shortstop. For these achievements, Don was selected to the 2nd Team All Sullivan Trail Conference (STC).

As a senior in 1987, he led the team in RBI's (22), total bases (39), triples (3), homeruns (2), and stolen bases (8). Don finished the season 2nd with a.304 batting average, 24 hits, 3 doubles and 19 runs while striking out only nine times in 94 official at bats. He was selected first team STC and was named MVP of the Red Raiders.

After graduation, Don attended Division 1 Lemoyne College playing two years before transferring to Division III Ithaca College where he excelled as a shortstop and 2nd baseman. He was a member of the Ithaca College baseball team that played in the Division III College World Series in 1991. Don had two homeruns and seven RBI's during that series. He was selected ECAC, Division III first team All-star (shortstop), and still holds the record at Ithaca for putouts and assists by a shortstop.

Don also played varsity basketball and soccer during his high school career. In 1987 he played in the STC Exceptional Senior game and in soccer was a 2nd team selection for the Steuben County All-star team. Don, along with his wife and daughter, reside in Hornell.

YVONNE SPELLECY CROWLEY '93

Yvonne Spellecy was an outstanding athlete at HHS. She participated in indoor and outdoor track and cross country. Yvonne earned four letters in each of these sports during her high school career. She was selected as the MVP for the cross country team in each of her four years of high school competition. In indoor track, Yvonne was the MVP her sophomore, junior and senior years. She won the same award in outdoor track in her junior year. 20 Yvonne earned the honor of running in the NY-SPHAA State Meet both in outdoor and indoor track her junior and senior seasons. She still holds the records in the 800 meters and the 1500 meters. She was the winner of the prestigious Debbie VanScoter Award as the outstanding female athlete her senior year.

Yvonne, her husband Steve, and their two daughters reside in Calera, Alabama.

ROBERT TALBETT '95

Robert Talbett earned nine letters during his high school career, two in football, one in baseball, and six in swimming. Rob was an outstanding swimmer for the Red Raiders. He made the varsity swim team as a 7th grader.

During his high school career, Rob participated in many of the swim events but he excelled as a diver off the 1 Meter board. He won numerous awards during his swimming career. As a freshman, he won the Andy Flaitz Memorial Award, as a sophomore he was the 1 Meter diving champ, and as a junior he won the Steuben County Swim League (SCSL) Most Improved Award.

It was during his senior year that everything fell into place for Rob: SCSL All-Star Diving Award, SCSL All-Star 200 Free Relay Award, STSL 100 Breaststroke Award, All Twin Tiers Award, MVP Boys Swim Team, Skinner Memorial Swim Award, Section V Class B Diving Champ, STSL Outstanding Male Senior, All STC honors in diving (11 dives 443.45 points-highest in the area), undefeated in diving in both Steuben County League & the STC, and 3rd place in the NYS Swimming and Diving Championship.

Rob held the Hornell pool record in 1 Meter diving for ten years. He competed at the college level at SUNY Alfred where he earned honorable mention All-American honors.

Rob resides in Lakewood, New York with his wife and two sons.

Gene Mastin stated that "Brian Young is truly one of the most exceptional athletes to play interscholastic athletics at Hornell High School in the last twenty years. He is the only player who played and started all four years on both the varsity football and basketball teams."

During his football career at Hornell, Brian earned the following honors: 1995 Finger Lakes East 1st Team QB, 1996 Finger Lakes East 2nd Team QB, 1997 New York State Class B 2nd Team QB, All Greater Rochester All-Star 1st Team, Section V Class B MVP, Section V Class B Champions, Finger Lakes East 1st Team QB, All-Corning Leader Football 1st Team, and set a school record for passing yards in a season.

As a member of the Varsity Basketball team, Brian received these honors: 1995 Steuben County All-Star 2nd Team, 1996 Sullivan Trail Conference Player of the Year, Sullivan Trail All-Star 1st Team, Corning Leader All Star 1st Team, Steuben County All Star 1st Team, Hornell Spectator Great 8 All Star 1st Team, All-Greater Rochester (honorable mention), 1997 Steuben County All Star 1st Team, Sullivan Trail All Star 2nd Team, Hornell Spectator Great 8 All Star 2nd Team, Corning Leader All Star 2nd Team, set the school record in 1998 for 3-point field goals in a game (8), Steuben County All Star 1st Team, Ronald McDonald All Star in Rochester, Sullivan Trail Conference All Star 1st Team, Hornell Spectator 8 All Star 1st Team, and Corning Leader All Star 1st Team. Brian was also named Co-Athlete of the Year at the K of C Sports Night.

After graduation, Brian attended Division III Ithaca College where he earned four letters in football and was the starting QB for three seasons. He led the Bombers to the NCAA quarterfinals.

Brian is currently living in Boston, MA and working for Strategic Marketing Affiliates, a Trade Mark licensing and Marketing firm for colleges, universities and athletic conferences.

MIKE DAVIDSON '73

The nomination of Mike Davidson '73 for the Hornell High School Hall of Fame was based primarily on his contributions as a coach for the HHS football program. While attending high school, Mike participated in football, swim, and track. He attended and graduated from Bucknell University. He played football for three years at the college.

Mike served as JV football coach at Hornell High School from 1984 through 1990, and again from 1998-2006. His achievements included at least four undefeated teams. Mike is directly responsible for developing the players who won Sectional Championships in 1987, 1988, 2004, and 2005. Without his contribution, HHS would not have achieved the championship level we have had throughout recent years.

Hornell Public Library Celebrates 140 Years!!


Many alumni will remember frequent visits to the Hornell Public Library on Genesee Street but may not realize that the Library has been serving the community for 140 years. It started in a room in a doctor's office in 1868. It moved on to several other locations. In 1911, with the courtesv of a donation from Andrew Carnegie, the Library relocated to its present site. The facility was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1975. A new addition was completed in 1999 which provided an elevator plus bathrooms and floor plans to allow access to the handicapped. This was followed by air conditioning and internet access.

The Hornell Public Library is a very busy place. It contains over 51,000 items—books, magazines, newspapers, videotapes, DVD's, audio book cassettes & CD's, and the latest in technological equipment. Genealogy resources include high school yearbooks that date back to 1856! During the summer months, nearly 500 young people enjoy various exciting programs while learning the importance of what the Library has to offer.

Last August, an annual appeal was sent to

a large number of Library users and Hornell residents. Many people in the community commented that they wished HHS alumni could be informed because there are many who would like to contribute. 





John F. Hillman Class of 1953






John F. Hillman, a native and lifelong resident of Hornell, passed away on September 18, 2008 following a long illness. John will long be remembered by the citizens of



Robert Eugene Becker, a graduate of Hornell High School class of 1940, passed away peacefully on December 19, 2008 in Mobile, AL. Bob was born in Wellsboro, PA, the son of Frank El




