

We've Come a Loooong Waaaay, Baby!

This past year, the Hornell High School Alumni Association Board of Directors learned a few interesting and important tidbits about our organization that we are thrilled to report to you, our valued members.

Thanks to John Price, HHS class of 1948, we have traced the history of our current organization and its true founder. Last July, Mr. Price contacted & sent a letter to the HHSAA Board, and to Neil Simon who is the Hornell Evening Tribune editor. He indicated that the names and photos of the co-founders on page 2 of the newsletter were incorrect. Mr. Price strongly urged us to do research on this very important topic. "Please establish credit where credit is due," he stated. After many months and numerous hours of intensive research, the Board needs to set the record straight.

It seems that the true founder of the Hornell High School Alumni Association is Carl L. Wellington who graduated in 1923. On December 5, 1945, a meeting was called to order by then Chairman Wellington and his voluntary committee consisting of the following HHS graduates: Francis M. Cameron, Virginia Leahy, Francis Conz, Kenneth Gray, William G. Hollands Jr., Henry Copeland, Sherman Shults, and Gertrude Case who was unanimously elected as secretary. The purpose of this preliminary meeting was to present the idea of organizing an association. According to the minutes of that meeting, "A motion was duly made by Charles Maher, seconded and unanimously carried, that we do hereby organize and establish an association to be known as the HORNELL HIGH SCHOOL ALUMNI ASSOCIATION." According to the first HHSAA Council meeting minutes dated December 10, 1945, Carl Wellington was elected and honored to become the first HHSAA President. Our appreciation goes to those dedicated men and women who recognized the importance of an organization that has lasted and thrived for almost seventy years.

We also want to recognize Charles Giallanza '40 and Jack Kohnke '41 who were actually the inspiration in starting an annual HHSAA News Journal. The first publication, which consisted of four pages, was completed and distributed in 1987. Today, we present to our faithful alumni, a newsletter with over eighty pages of 'local news of interest' articles, HHS graduate updates, 'A

December 5, 1945: The Hornell Alumni Association is Born!

The date was December 5, 1945. It is what organizers called a "special committee" of Hornell High School alumni who met in the high school library. The purpose, according to the minutes of that session almost seven decades ago, was to

organize and found the Hornell High School Alumni Association. Imagine that cold pre-winter night, the bustle of the holiday season nearly underway, and a fledgling group meets, intent on starting a high school alumni organization. How many people would that meeting attract today?

In 1945, the list of attendees was long with nearly fifty (50) people at the session. Ruth P. Torrence was there, a proud 1914 graduate of Hornell High School. So was Cecelia M. Taylor (class of 1905), and Louise Parkhill (class of 1888).

The meeting was chaired by Carl L. Wellington, who five days later would be elected president of the association. The minutes list the Hornell High School graduates making up that first

committee, in addition to Wellington, as Francis M. Cameron, Virginia Leahy, Francis Conz, Kenneth Gray, William G. Hollands Jr., Henry Copeland, Sherman Shults and Gertrude Case.

Wellington noted in remarks that night that a "preliminary committee had been under consideration for some time." Indeed, just one month prior to this meeting, an Evening Tribune article reports that 100 people attended a planning session for the new association. The bylaws of the Hornell Alumni Association were proposed and adopted on that December 5, 1945 night.

The first annual meeting and dinner was held at the Hotel Sherwood on June 27, 1946.

The keynote speaker at the banquet expressed optimism that the Hornell Alumni Association would survive the passage of time, due to its commitment to "doing good for others by awarding scholarships annually."

Who founded the Hornell High School Alumni Association? The best answer, after studying those old meeting minutes and newspaper articles, is this: dozens and dozens of the sons & daughters of Hornell...proud HHS graduates... founded this cherished organization. It was a group effort. Each initial contribution, large and small, was indispensible to its continual mission which is to promote Hornell High School and assist its graduates.

Helen Harris '47 was awarded the 2nd scholarship. And, in June of 1948. Anne Cianciosi '48 was honored to receive the 3rd award of \$200. Since that time, we estimate that our organi-

zation has distributed over two million dollars in scholarship money to graduating seniors. Now, that IS incredible!

DID YOU KNOW???

The 1st Annual Hornell High School Alumni Association Banquet was held at The Hotel Sherwood on June 27, 1946. The Dodd Quartet provided the entertainment. A meeting was also held and the bylaws were officially adopted. According to the adopted minutes, "President Wellington recognized Harrison S. Dodge as Superintendent of Schools; introduced Mr. Clemenceau "Kelly" Simons '37 who gave a very interesting address; recognized Mr. George Sims (class of 1895) as the oldest alumnus present; and, acknowledged the untimely death of Francis M. Cameron (class of 1898) who helped in the establishing the HHS Alumni Association." Thirty-three (33) members attended the first annual banquet and meeting.

There were seventy-two (72) alumni present at the 2nd Annual HHS Alumni Association Banquet & Meeting on June 26, 1947. President Carl Wellington expressed that "he was particularly pleased and gratified at the turnout for the banquet. He was confident that the current Board had laid a firm foundation, and was definitely on the road to success." Little did he know how large this association would become!



MINUTES OF THE FIRST MEETING
OF HORNELL HIGH SCHOOL ALUMNI CONVENED BY A SPECIAL
COMMITTEE FOR THE PURPOSE OF ORGANIZING THE

HORNELL HIGH SCHOOL ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

Held at Hornell High School Library on Wednesday, December 5th 1945 at 8:00 P. M.

The meeting was called to order by Carl L. Wellington Chairman of a voluntary committee of Hornell High School graduates consisting of Francis M. Cameron, Virginia Leahy, Francis Conz, Kenmeth Gray, William G. Hollands Jr., Henry Copeland, Sherman Shults and Carl L. Wellington and Mr. Wellington was unanimously chosen as Chairman of the meeting. Mrs. Gertrude Case was unanimously chosen as Secretary of the meeting.

The Secretary also noted the presence of the following representa-tives of the official staff of Hornell High School and the Board of Education of the City School District of the City of Hornell:

Arthur M. Seaman, President of the Board of Education. Harrison S. Dodge, Superintendent of Schools. Edward W. Cooke, Principal of Hornell High School.

Chairman Wellington made a brief address stating that the preliminary committee had under consideration for some time the organization of an Alumni Association of Hornell High School and after many sessions concluded that such an organization was most desirable and that it would be a very effective body in support of the High School and its activities. That they had selected the name HORNELL HIGH SCHOOL ALUMNI ASSOCIATION, prepared preliminary by-laws under which the organization could function until the first annual meeting of the members to be held during the month of June 1946, and called this meeting together for the purpose of getting the matter under way. He stated that it was the sense of the committee that certain worthy objectives be established in order to make the project effective and, smong other things stressed the granting of scholastic scholarships from funds derived in the main from dues of the members. He also stated that the organization would necessarily involve considerable detail work and correspondence and suggested that it might be advisable to provide for the services of a paid Secretury. At the conclusion of Mr. Wellington's remarks several persons present expressed themselves as being in favor of organizing such an association by appropriate action to be taken at this meeting which seemed to be a very representative body of Hornell High School Alumni.

A motion was duly made by Charles Maher, seconded and unanimously carried, that we do hereby organize and establish an association to be known as HORNELL HIGH SCHOOL ALUMNI ASSOCIATION.


On motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, the meeting adjourned.

How Are Scholarship Recipients Chosen?

The Hornell High School Alumni tradition strives to encourage and support life-styles that have strong work ethics, public service and academic achievement by rewarding students who exemplify these characteristics with recognition and financial assistance for their education.

A silent committee serves at the pleasure of the President of the Alumni Board. This group is always kept confidential.

It may come as a surprise, but this is truly a secret committee and never discussed. Board members don't have a clue! A meeting is called by the Superintendent of Schools and the President of the Alumni Board.

The silent committee, school officials, teachers and guidance counselors meet for the first time. Every senior is offered an opportunity to fill out an application. The Superintendent provides a detailed resume of all students: student class ranking, financial need, student activities, desire for higher education (school choice), cost, student character, personality, and potential leadership.

All selections are final. No records leave the school and resumes of the students are returned and kept confidential.

H.A.A. Endowment Fund

The Hornell Alumni Association is a recognized charitable organization under the rules and regulations of the I.R.S. The Alumni Association is a 501 (C) (3) charitable organization so that donations made to it are deductible.

Since approximately 1995, the Alumni Association hired the Steuben Trust

Company to provide investment management services through a Trust Agreement for some of its excess money. The fund has grown in value due to its diversified investments between fixed income and equity investments. Since it has grown in value, it enables the Alumni Association to grant more scholarships.



Coates was a well-known and popular Hornell businessman who ran Coates Auto Service for many years. He was also a Canaseraga firefighter and New York State trooper. Denny passed away on September 15, 2013.



Attention HHS Alumni Transcript Archive Available in the Guidance Office!

There is an archive of students who attended and/ or graduated from Hornell High School. The files have transcripts that date back to the early 1900's and are sorted alphabetically. A lot of the transcripts from the 1900's thru 1930's have photos attached. The actual form varied over the years but most of them have courses with grades, parent names, address, date of birth, what school the student transferred from & when, their graduation date or why they left before graduating (to go to work, to war, etc). Some include rank & average, diploma type, PSAT, and SAT scores. There are older transcripts that even have I.Q.'s listed, elementary grades, state tests, and health records.

Students transferred to the high school from Columbian, Bryant, Lincoln, North Hornell, St. Ann's, Irving, and Washington Schools. Some of them even transferred from the one room schools like Big Creek and Crosby Creek. There is a lot of family history in this archive. When you flip through the files, it is easy to tell which students were siblings, and if their parents and/or grandparents also attended Hornell High School. Some of them were born at home, and had no documentation of their actual birth date. There is a lot of family history in these files.

Almost daily, the guidance office receives calls from companies that do background checks on potential new employees to confirm high school graduation. A high school transcript is confidential, which means the public is not permitted to come in and just browse through the files. If a former student of any age that is applying to college or would like a copy of their transcript, please contact the high school via a phone call, email, or a written request. A copy of your driver's license is necessary in order to obtain your transcript. Ladies, please remember that you need to provide your maiden name.

To Whom It May Concern:

I have written this letter in hopes that it may be received by someone who may have knowledge of the following historical events. I met Mrs. Marion Faulkner several years ago at a social function in Lancaster, PA. It appears that the two of us lived in Homell at the same time, and enjoyed some similar circumstances.

My family moved from Bath to North Hornell in 1930 when I was five years old. In those days, there was no such grade called kindergarten nor was there a device known as a school bus. My walk from home to North Hornell School was not very long. I still have the carpenter hammer that I found on the way to school that first day!

We lived at 404 Seneca Road in a house owned by the Landers. Two blocks behind our house was Blades Paving Co. My dad opened a business known as Higgs Tire Shop that was located in Horton's Gas Station across the street from The Big Elms Restaurant. Several years after we moved, my

mom gave birth to my sister Phyllis at Bethesda Hospital. I recall watching circus construction and their shows in several fields near us. Our family employed the habit of going for rides on Sunday afternoons. We sometimes went to Arkport to see their airport which contained a device known as an autogyro.

Although the school was relatively new, it had only four large classrooms, each of which contained two grades. It also had an auditorium and possibly a gym. Behind the school was a hilly golf course. We used its hills in the winter for sledding. Classmates and neighbors whose names I remember are John Johnson, Kenneth Just, Robert Rowe, George Smith (whose father was an executive at Steuben Trust), and my neighbor, Earl New. I also recall the Vogel, Callahan, Strobel, and Hubert families. A man by the name of Mal Fletcher was a friend of my folks. He was a local piano tuner. When not in school, I sometimes accompanied Mal into the countryside to collect upright pianos which he carried on the rear bumper of his car!

My family belonged to a large Methodist church that was located on the edge of a park in downtown Homell. This is where my sister and I were baptized. When I was about ten years old, we moved to Elmira. After a short stay there, we moved again to Canisteo where my father opened a new Horton gas station in the center of town. At age eleven, my family returned to our hometown of Akron, Ohio.

Although I didn't live in the Hornell area for very long, I continue to have wonderful memories. Does any of the above information sound familiar to the older alumni? I just wanted to share my thoughts with you.

On the track, the Raiders had tremendous quality, just not enough quantity. The 400M Relay (seniors Brendan Buisch, James

Cipriano, Nils Kirschstein, and Marcus McClinton) finished first at the LCAA Meet and fourth at the Section V Championships. Bacon was the LCAA Discus Champion with a personal best of 141-06. 




FESTIVITIES 2013



MEGAN WIGGERS PORTA Class of 2002

During her career at Hornell High School, Megan participated in girls swimming, track and tennis at the varsity level. Megan earned 8 varsity letters during that time span. In track Megan was a pole vaulter, a relatively new event for female athletes. During her senior year Megan set the school record in that event.

Megan excelled in the sport of swimming. Her greatest achievements were in that sport. She swam for 5 years on the swim team from 1997 to 2001. During those years, she broke records in 9 of the 12 swimming events. Six of those records were individual records: 200 Free, 200 Individual Medley, 50 Free, 100 Free, 500 Free, and the 100 Breaststroke. The three other records came in relays: 200 Medley, 200 Free Relay, and the 400 Free Relay. The Hornell Girls Swim Team posted a record of 45 wins and only 5 losses during Megan's last three years on the team.

For her outstanding record and accomplishments, Megan received the following awards: The Andy Flaitz Memorial Swim Award, the James J. Dagon Character Award, and the Debbie VanScoter Award symbolic of the top female athlete of the year.

Megan was an honor student, a member of the National Honor Society, and a Bausch and Lomb Award Winner. After high school, she remained active in sports by participating in triathlons, marathons, and as an assistant swim

Megan is a registered pharmacist and resides in Parsons, Kansas with her husband, son and daughter.

RICK DAILEY

Class of 1980

Rick Dailey was a stellar athlete in both football and baseball during his high school career at Hornell. In football, Rick played varsity for three years. He was a standout player during his junior and senior seasons. He was the starting linebacker his junior year, and tight end and defensive back his senior year.

Rick excelled as a member of the Hornell baseball team during the coaching career of Leonard Caruso. Rick played varsity during his sophomore, junior and senior years. Without him, the program would never have been as successful as it was. Rick was the individual that made everyone play better. He was tough, hard working, disciplined, and committed to whatever had to be done to make the team better."

After graduation, Rick attended Cornell University. He had an outstanding career in football for three seasons. He was a defensive specialist, playing linebacker during his sophomore & junior seasons, and strong safety his senior year

Rick, his wife Laurie, and their three children live in Beleville, PA.

KATE GLEASON SECONDO

Class of 1992

During her high school career, Kate earned 12 varsity letters, four (4) in soccer, four (4) in basketball, three (3) in softball and one (1) in track.

In soccer as a sophomore, Kate was named to the Sullivan Trail 2nd Team. She earned 1st team honors during her junior and senior years. As a senior, she was named MVP of the Hornell team by her coach, Yvonne Knataitis. In basketball, she was named to the Sullivan Trail All-Star 2nd Team as a senior.

Kate was an outstanding 2nd baseman for the Hornell softball team. She earned 2nd team honors as an all-star her junior and senior years. She was a member of the Section V Championship Team her junior year in 1991.

Kate's biggest accomplishment came in her senior year as she was awarded the Debbie VanScoter Award for the top female athlete at Hornell High School.

After graduation, John attended Delhi College, and transferred to Kent State University where he graduated Magna Cum Laude. John was a CPA and lived in Wilmington, NC.

GENE MASTIN

Gene Mastin arrived in Hornell thirty years ago after coaching at Cuba Central School and Cameron County Emporium High School in PA.

From 1970 through 1982, Hornell football won only 36% of its games. Gene took over a program that was struggling and going through some difficult times. He revamped the entire program. Football was no longer a four month proposition from August through October. It became a year round program that included weight lifting and a commitment from those who played the game for him.

There are many adjectives to describe Gene and his program: quality, organization, hard work, and demanding of self, coaches and players. What did this bring to Hornell football and the community? An overall record of 220 wins, 56 loses, 3 ties, and winning 80% of the games played; an all time winning coach in Section V; only 3 losing seasons (1985, 1989, and 1994); A 39 game winning streak; and THREE (3) New York State Class B Championships.

Gene continues to live in Hornell with his wife Cheryl and daughter Nicole.

DR. ISMAIL MEHR '91:

My Reflections and Memories

When I look back at my days at Hornell High School, my memories inevitably always involve football and the life lessons that I learned. Coach Gene Mastin prepared me for so much more than how to play a game. His coaching instilled lessons for life that could not be taught in any classroom. The two most important lessons that have remained with and benefitted me throughout my life are Work Ethic and to Believe in Oneself. These were instilled in me because I was privileged to have played for Coach Mastin.

Through the years, I have always appreciated Coach Mastin. From my days at college when I walked on to University at Buffalo's football team, through my years in medical school, and my days as

a resident specializing in anesthesia. But it wasn't until I returned to Hornell and had the privilege of joining his coaching staff, that I was able to appreciate him so much more. As a player, I saw and experienced things from a different perspective. As a coach on his staff, I had a unique vantage point to see firsthand how one handles young men from various socio-economic backgrounds, and all of the unfortunate problems that many of them experience outside of school. For some of these young men, football provided the family that they needed so badly. Actually, it wasn't the game of football but rather the Red Raider brotherhood that helped so many. Life is not as simple as it was when I was a teen. The family setup has changed drastically. It takes a unique individual to understand this, and to be able to work with young men who also may be carrying so much within.

Success is not always the result of superior players and game planning. I saw this very early in

my coaching career. It was Coach Mastin's ability to bring out the best in each & every kid, and to be able to understand their abilities, strengths, & weaknesses. His commitment in never cheating a team in practice by being ill-prepared himself, he demanded the same of himself, his coaching staff, and his players. Coach Mastin never failed at giving 150% of his time and effort while preparing a team.

To better understand and appreciate him, all one has to do is look at the 2008 season. Death is inevitable and, at times, untimely. It is always a difficult thing to deal with for young men, yet alone adults. The death of Dylan McCormick was a great loss. He was a teammate, a player, and a young man full of life. Words will never do justice to how Coach Mastin was able to help these young men cope with this loss. Not a loss on the scoreboard but a loss that was real. It hurt like nothing they had ever experienced before. The way in which Coach Mastin led these grieving


young men would be enough for him to be rightfully honored as a member of the Hornell High School Sports Hall of Fame.


to the continued help and support of the community. The outlook for the coming year is starting to show signs of improvement. We have received




STARLITE Drive-in-theatre (submitted by Timothy Plank)


