





How are Scholarship Recipients Chosen?

The Hornell High School Alumni tradition strives to encourage and support life-styles that have strong work ethics, public service, and academic achievement by rewarding students who exemplify these characteristics with recognition and financial assistance for their education.

A silent committee serves at the pleasure of the President of the Alumni Board. This group is always kept confidential. It may come as a surprise but this is truly a secret committee and never discussed. Board members don't have a clue! A meeting is called by the Superintendent of Schools and the HHSAA President.

The silent committee, school officials, teachers, and guidance counselors meet for the first time. Every senior is offered an opportunity to fill out an application.

The Superintendent provides a detailed resume of all students: student class ranking, financial need, student activities, desire for higher education (school choice), cost, student character, personality, and potential leadership.

All selections are final. No records leave the school and resumes of the students are returned and kept confidential.

The Wildwood Campus had many changes at the start of the 2017 school year. Several teachers retired and program enrollment increased which required fourteen new teachers/teaching assistants to join the Wildwood family. It has been wonderful working with our new employees.

Superintendent's Letter

Another year and another letter to the alumni of the Hornell City School District. I can't believe how fast this year has flown by. You may or may not be aware, but this will be my last year as your superintendent. I would like to personally thank the HHS Alumni Association for their support over the past six years that I have served. Without your support and generous contributions to the graduates of Hornell, our students would not be in the position they are in as they enter adulthood. support goes well beyond the scholarships offered to them. It is your influence and guidance that makes any graduate of Hornell proud to be an alumnus. "Once a Raider...Always a Raider".

I would like to bring you up to speed on our current capital building project. Renovations to the pool at the Intermediate School were completed. I welcome and encourage you to visit the building to see this amazing transformation of space. Work has begun at the Junior/Senior High School. Soon, both parking lots will be completely redone and a new bus loop will be created on the west side of the school exiting on Adsit Street. Numerous classroom renovations will occur in the Irving wing, as well as in both the A and B gyms.

The budget outlook for the upcoming year is very positive due to diligence on the district's part in controlling expenses and maximizing our revenues. In addition, we are maximizing the use of our reserves to maintaining a modest tax increase of approximately 0.65%.

Pending a successful budget vote, we expect to restore a number of positions previously cut during more stressful financial times. Our focus in restoring positions will be early elementary grades, classroom teachers, and a reading specialist. Our students' success depends strongly on their ability to



read and comprehend a variety of literature. Our goal is to get all of our students reading on grade level by the time they reach 9th grade, minimizing the need for additional intervention services.

In closing, I would like to take this time to recognize our administrators and staff, who over the past three years have worked diligently to improve our graduation rate. I am pleased to announce that it now exceeds the state requirement, and has grown 22% in the last three years. Congratulations!







The Hornell Armory is a historic National Guard building. Designed by architect Isaac G. Perry, it is a brick and stone castle-like structure built in 1894. The three-story main structure has a four-story round corner tower. Attached to the main structure is an additional pair of two-story corner towers. Extending from the main structure is a long two-story wing with a gable roof and corner stair tower. The Hornell Armory was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1980.







At the LCAA Championship, Josh brought home County Titles, winning both the 3000M Steeplechase and the 3200M. Walsh was also the Section V Champion in the Steeple with teammate Austin Miller placing third. Josh took 3rd in the 3200M to cap off an outstanding day. At the NYS Qualifier Meet, Josh placed 3rd in the 3200M with a personal best of 10:03.03.

In the field, Caleb Burdett had an outstanding spring season winning both the Shot and Discus throughout the league season.

At the LCAA Meet, Tyler brought home a second place in the 400M. The Boys finished 2-3, but were competitive in every meet, dropping three by narrow margins. 
GIRLS SWIMMING & DIVING

GIRLS BASKETBALL-



"Breaking Bad": My Story by June Burdick Gardner '67



Forty one years after graduation from Hornell High School, my family was given a rare and wonderful opportunity. Our house was chosen to be the home of the characters "Hank and Marie"

on the television show Breaking Bad.

In June of 2008, a woman came to my house, and introduced herself as the Assistant Location Manager for Topanga Productions, which was a part of Sony Television. She explained the story of the show Breaking Bad, and that they needed a home on a cul-desac that had space for their filming equipment. I showed her around our house & yard, she took notes, and then said she'd let me know. Three weeks later, I received a call that our home had been chosen! A month later, a bus drove up to our house with the *Breaking Bad* crew and the director, Bryan Cranston.

We found out what it means to be in the film business. Our neighbors had to be informed each time that the crew and actors came to work. We also found out what a prep, film, and strike day were. Learning about the 'family' that was going to be living in our house was just as interesting. 'Hank' was a DEA agent pursuing his drug dealer brother-in-law (played by Bryan Cranston), and his wife 'Marie' was a kleptomaniac with a serious purple fetish.

The cast and crew treated us so well. They became part of our family. My husband and I were always invited to the wrap parties. All of the actors and crew members got together to say goodbye until the start of the next session. It was like a Red Carpet affair. When Bryan Cranston won his Emmy for best actor in a television series, we were invited to Sound Studios to have a celebration lunch.

Brvan Cranston and June became verv good friends.

Our home was used for six consecutive years. My husband and I were actually actors for a quick scene in season 5, episode 8. We started at 7:00 am, had to take three changes of clothes, and finished at 8:00 pm. It was a long, hard, and fun day. September 29, 2013 was the 'Grand Finale' of *Breaking Bad*. The whole city of Albuquerque was saying goodbye in different ways. The experience of being part of this show has left me with the most wonderful memories.

To this day, fans drive by our home and take pictures, some arriving with 'props' & costumes'. They come from all over the world. We've met people from Japan, Australia, and England. A few will even knock on the door wanting to see the inside of our house. My husband and I loved every minute of being part of the *Breaking Bad* show, and will always treasure that time in our lives.



We even swam in the pond or lake when we had the chance. We ate beans & hot dogs, mac & cheese, and peanut butter sandwiches. We walked or rode a bikes everywhere, and never worried about safety. We never thought to lock our windows or doors at night. We had chores to do around the house. We ate our meals as a family together, and helped clean the table when we were done.

We weren't afraid of ANYTHING...accept our parents. If you fell down, you would just get back up. We challenged each other everywhere...'King of the Hill'. If someone had a fight, that's what it was...a fight. Kids weren't afraid of fake guns when I grew up. Real guns were just a part of life. We respected them as we did our parents, teachers, the principal, the



American flag, AND God. We said the Pledge of Allegiance every time we went to school. We left our houses as soon as we could in the morning until our neighbors would yell out for their children as a reminder to get in the house at night. Congratulations, Samuele Argentieri '17







The Moving Wall Heals and Teaches

The first week of June 2016, between eight to ten thousand people made time to visit the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Moving Wall during the five day exhibit at Arkport Cycles. It has the names of more than 58,000 U.S. service members killed or missing in the war. The event included over 50 local sponsors. 150 people volunteered their efforts, both in planning and in working at the site during the week.



The main reason for bringing the wall to Arkport was for educational purposes. Several school districts arranged field trips for their students to see the wall. Two teenage girls from Alleghany County used commemorative strips of paper to rub the names of 2nd Lt. Carol Drazba and 2nd Lt. Elizabeth Ann Jones who died together in a helicopter crash near Saigon in 1966. Both were 22 years old.

Unlike the men and women today who are not forced to be in the war, most of these men had no choice because of the draft. The women chose to serve their country. Arkport Mayor Charles Flanders shared that "after the wreath laying ceremony, people were literally frozen in place for about three minutes, as a palpable period of self-reflection slowly became one of collective recognition". The wall was a time to appreciate the things that these brave men and women sacrificed.

A Principal's Promise Becomes a Reality

As an incentive for the Hornell Intermediate School students to read during the 2015-16 school year, Principal Sean Gaffney said he would kiss a guinea pig if they read 3000 books, a mini-micro pig if they read 6000, and a full-sized pig if the students read 9000 books. Well, they read a total of 10000 books during year. For a special celebration, the children walked in a parade from the Intermediate School to the Hornell High School last June. 






An Old Grocery Store Sign Takes Us Back to the Past

Not Taken for Granite

Scott Teller of Hornell has been creating granite images of fallen soldiers from wars dating back to Vietnam for the last five years to honor the sacrifice of America's servicemen and women. Since 1775, over 1.5 million Americans have been wounded or killed defending our country. "It's not about me. It's about the people in the pictures," said Teller. He's often asked if the images on the plagues are made with a computer program. But they are actually engraved by hand using a 6000 rpm diamond-tipped drill to etch images into the black granite. Scott does sell his 'Patriot Plagues' but he also gives them to the families of fallen soldiers including local heroes Marine Cpl. and Congressional Medal of Honor recipient Jason Dunham, Marine Corporal Zachary Smith, and Army Sgt. Devin Snyder. He does extensive research in order to get to know the person behind the image he engraves. Teller says that the community has been very supportive of his work. Their Love for Corvettes

In 1986, Govenor Mario Cuomo was in Hornell touring its railcar facility at what is now *Alstom*. At the time, he saw a train car that he always took in New York City. He was extremely excited by the sight of it because this had been his dream, to start building railway cars in New York State. Mayor Shawn Hogan followed through with the idea using the former Erie Lackawanna railroad shops to refurbish and build railcars. The story goes that Governor Cuomo, as he saw the train, pointed to it and a picture was taken. Mayor Shawn Hogan held on to the picture for over thirty years.

Last December, Mario Cuomo's son, Andrew who is currently the 56th governor of New York, took a trip to Hornell to discuss expanding the Alstom Railcar facility. When he arrived, Mayor Hogan pulled him aside and gave Andrew the picture of his father that he had saved. Governor Cuomo was very emotional, appreciative, and touched by Hogan's gesture. He now realizes his dad's passion, and the picture showed him where it all started.

A 'Can-Do-It' Attitude at Cider Creek

After almost three years of operation, Cider Creek Hard Cider made a major shift in the production of their craft cider when cans began rolling off the production line at its Cunningham Creek Road location in Canisteo. Owners, Kevin & Melanie Collins, hope it will pay big dividends as they seek to expand and become a nationally recognized brand. As soon as they were cased, the cider headed out the door to wholesalers in New York, Connecticut, Rhode Island, and as far away as Western Canada.

The transition was made in-part at the request of Wingman's, a major distributor of Cider Creek cider, because smaller cans can be offered to customers at a lower price. Careful consideration went into the design of the cans. Cider Creek wanted to maintain the original appearance of their high quality, small-batch craft product.

It is a major step for the business and speaks to the solid footing it has achieved in a short period of time. Collins was quick to add that the key to their growth has been the strong support from a local fan base.

To kick off 2017, Cider Creek Hard Cider began offering food to go along with their craft ciders. Pizzas featuring locally sourced artisanal cheeses, meats, and produce will kick off the menu options. From there, it will expand to panini style sandwiches and the creation of several unique pairings. The Collins' see this as a first step toward full-scale dining at Cider Creek.

Bill was a two year starting point guard on what is arguably the best basketball team in HHS history. He was a floor general who controlled the pace of the game, and was also the team's top defensive player. During his career, Bill averaged 9 points and 5 assists per game, and was a player who always made his teammates better.

On the football field, Bill is remembered as a hard hitting defensive back and an explosive punt & kick returner. He was a two year varsity starter with many electrifying kick returns. He was also a shut down defender who had three interceptions in one game against Seton Catholic High School.

Bill was a two year varsity starter on the HHS baseball team. He played both infield and outfield for the Raiders. As a junior, Bill played an important role in helping the Raiders to a 21-4 record and a Section V Class AA championship. As with the other sports he played, Bill will be remembered not only for his skills, but for his toughness on the field.

Bill completed his high school career by being awarded the Emory Curtis Award which is given to the HHS senior athlete who shows the most team spirit.

After high school, Bill played baseball at Monroe Community College for two years before earning a baseball scholarship to Division 1 Arkansas State University. While at MCC, Bill became a catcher and batted .444 in his second year. Bill led Arkansas State in batting average both years that he played there. As a senior, he batted .316 and was named as an All-Star of the Sunbelt Conference.

Bill is married to his high school sweetheart, Debbie Lorow Murray. They have one son, Lucas, who is currently earning his Master's Degree in accounting at the University of Virginia. Bill is employed as a Sales Representative at Rawlings Sporting Goods and resides in Gaithersburg, Maryland.

At the conclusion of her senior year, Meghan received the Penny Bassage Memorial Award which she holds dear to her heart. Prior to her passing, Penny was Meghan's softball coach, mentor and a great influence on her life. Penny was a huge inspiration to Meghan throughout her entire athletic career.

Meghan went on to star for the SUNY Brockport soccer team. While she was there, Brockport had some of their best seasons in the school's history, having set school records for most wins in a season as well as most consecutive games without a loss (14). During those years, Meghan was the team's top defender and was selected to the All-SUNYAC team (twice) as well as the NYS All-State Honors team and NCAA Division III All-New York Region team.

Meghan received a Bachelor's Degree in education from SUNY Brockport and a Master's Degree in Sports Health Science from the United States Sports Academy. She taught physical education and Health at Oakbrook Middle School and at Ashley Ridge High School in Charleston, SC. He finished his high school career by being selected to play in the Ronald McDonald allstar game as a senior.

On the football field, Scott was a three year starting tight end and a two year starting defensive end for the Red Raiders. Scott's teams were Section V champions and NYS semi-finalists in both his junior and senior years.






