



How are Scholarship Recipients Chosen?

The Hornell High School Alumni tradition strives to encourage and support life-styles that have strong work ethics, public service, and academic achievement by rewarding students who exemplify these characteristics with recognition and financial assistance for their education.

A silent committee serves at the pleasure of the President of the Alumni Board. This group is always kept confidential. It may come as a surprise but this is truly a secret committee and never discussed. Board members don't have a clue! A meeting is called by the Superintendent of Schools and the HHSAA President.

The silent committee, school officials, teachers, and guidance counselors meet for the first time. Every senior is offered an opportunity to fill out an application.

The Superintendent provides a detailed resume of all students: class ranking, financial need, student activities, desire for higher education (school choice), cost, student character, personality, and potential leadership.

All selections are final. No records leave the school and resumes of the students are returned and kept confidential.

Hornell High School Alumni Association Endowment Fund

The Hornell High School Alumni Association is a recognized charitable organization under the rules and regulations of the I.R.S. The HHS Alumni Association is a 501 (C) (3) charitable organization so that donations made to it are deductible.

Since approximately 1995, the HHSAA hired Steuben Trust Company to provide investment management services through a Trust Agreement for some of its excess money. The fund has grown in value due to its diversified investments between fixed income and equity investments. Since it has grown

in value, it enables the HHS Alumni Association to grant more scholarships.



"A Wonderful Life"

PLEASE NOTE: Chris Potter is the Regional Director at the Hornell Evening Tribune. Last December, he interviewed Mayor Hogan and summarized their conversation in an article for the newspaper. It was very thorough and beautifully written. On behalf of the HHSAA Board of Directors, we would like to extend our appreciation to Chris for allowing us to share some of its contents with our HHS alumni.



Shawn Hogan '70 reflects on thirty-two (32) years as mayor of the Maple City.

Hornell: Born and Bred Shawn Hogan is a fifthgeneration Hornellian. An ancestor, John Hogan, immigrated to the United States from Ireland in the 1840s. Shawn describes his great-great grandfather as a "hard-scrabble farmer" who found employment on the Erie Railroad.

The immigrant family found the better life it was seeking in Hornell. The Hogan's settled in and put down roots, the fruits of which John Hogan could have hardly imagined in those early days on a new continent. His great-grandson, Francis, served as mayor of Hornell in the mid-20th century. Francis had a son, Shawn, who would go on to play an even bigger role in charting the Maple City's future course.

Shawn Hogan grew up in a bygone era, a time when every need could be satisfied locally in the city. Many families didn't even own a car; they didn't need one. Men could walk to work, and neighborhood shops provided everything a household required. The railroad industry played an outsized role in the city's fortunes. At one point in time, the Hornell Erie Railroad employed 5,000 people. That economic engine fueled the entire city. A host of specialty shops catered to every need, and the city streets hummed with comings & goings. It was an exciting time for a young boy growing up amongst the hustle and bustle of a busy city.

Jumping into the Fray: It started in the mid-1980s. Hogan was thirty-three years old, had a growing family, and a job with the Department of Labor. Everything seemed to be on track, until he learned there was a good possibility he could be transferred to Central New York or the Albany area. Hogan didn't want to make the move. He was born and raised in Hornell. Leaving home and saying goodbye to his beloved community sounded like an untenable proposition. He decided to run for the open mayoral position, and won the election with 52 percent of the vote...a landslide in a three-way race. That's when the work started.

Successes and Setbacks: Hogan has helped shape much of Hornell's past, present, and future over the last three-plus decades. He received a valuable lesson in the challenges associated with leadership — it's impossible to please everyone. Sitting in the mayor's seat for thirty-two years, Hogan has seen first-hand the ebbs and flows a community experiences over the years. His administration hasn't been untouched by heartache and disappointment. Through it all, though, Hogan has maintained his faith in the community and its power to overcome any & all challenges. A common theme of Hogan's tenure has been remaining positive through times of plenty as well as times of doubt.

A Wonderful Life: As he gets ready to pass the torch to mayor-elect John Buckley, Hogan can reflect on a job well done. The Maple City might be on the brink of its biggest boom since his days as a youth. Industry is strong, business investment is on the upswing, and housing projects are underway across the city, revitalizing buildings and communities for a new era. Hogan isn't sailing off into the sunset. He's accepted a part-time position at the IDA where he'll work with Jim Griffin who has been his partner on so many projects over the years.

For a time, it was hard to imagine stepping out of the mayor's seat after thirty-two years. Hogan's example has been one of active civic involvement and positivity, one he hopes will grow in his absence. "I've had so many emotional moments as it winds down. I get teary-eyed," Hogan said. "Then, I think about how fortunate I am. It's been a real blessing to be able to serve this community. I think about the movie, *It's a Wonderful Life*. Not to sound corny, but I'd like to think that I have made an impact in Hornell like George Bailey did in Bedford Falls."

"It truly has been a wonderful life."

A Special Tribute to a Special Man

Shawn Hogan graduated from Hornell High School in 1970. Four years later, he received his BBA in Business Administration from Saint Bonaventure University. He was the Mayor of the City of Hornell, New York since January of 1986. Last December, after thirty-two (32) years of service and devotion as our Chief Executive Officer, Shawn retired. He became New York's longest tenured city mayor holding office.

Shawn was instrumental in working to revitalize the City of Hornell. The community experienced record commercial growth during his tenure in office. He put in place a major capital improvement program to rebuild Hornell's infrastructure, established a working labor/management committee, and acted as the chief labor relations negotiator on behalf of the City.

On Saturday, November 18, 2017, a party was held at The Main Place in honor of Shawn's retirement.

Guests included many city employees, friends, and family members. A 'Through the Years' video was displayed continuously throughout the evening for

everyone to enjoy. It contained numerous photos of Shawn during his many years of service. This was a wonderful and special celebration that acknowledged a very deserving man.



Shawn is married to the former Holly Horton. They have four wonderful children who are all proud graduates of HHS, and nine beautiful grandchildren. Congratulations, good luck, and best wishes to Shawn & his family.

The Patriot Teen Night Club was open from 1965 through 1971. High school teachers Lyle Barron along with his wife Sharon, and Billy Schu & his wife Irene took a trip to Wellsboro to a young adult dance club. They couldn't believe how many people

were in attendance. On their way home, they decided to open something similar in Hornell. They started out by renting the Odd Fellows Hall on Broadway, and then moved to a building across the tracks from the Sunset Inn. It was painted with red and blue polka dots. Dances were held weekly with live bands. On a given night, they averaged over 200 teens in attendance with some nights reaching as many as 1,500 people. 
and Commitment' which defines Zach to a tee.

A total of twelve people were murdered and seventy injured. There were approximately 100 Southern Tier first responders in the audience.

Dailey described the incident as being so bad that police officers transported many victims to hospitals because fire department staff were bound by regulations to await battalion chiefs to dispatch ambulances to medical centers. Dailey offered a long list of tips for police departments to help prepare other officers on ways to prevent such incidents. Training and planning sessions are very important. Anybody who might be a first responder needs to practice and work on communication techniques.

Dailey's presentation was very intense and extremely educational.

He was also an All-Greater Rochester honorable mention. During that season, Craig recorded eleven shutouts as the Raiders returned to the sectional championship game. As a senior, Craig recorded a school record of fifteen shutouts



while giving up only four goals the entire season. He was named LCAA Player of the Year, was a 2^{nd} Team All-Corning Leader, and 2^{nd} Team All-Greater Rochester selection. He finished his HHS soccer career with a school record of thirty-five (35) shutouts which still stands.

Craig also had an outstanding high school career in tennis where he earned four (4) varsity letters. As a sophomore, he played #3 singles and qualified for sectionals in doubles with his partner, Ed McNelis. He finished out his tennis career as the team's #1 tennis player and partnered with Ed McNelis to win a Section V doubles match, and qualify for Super Sectionals. During the spring of his senior year, Craig was named the K of C Sports Night Co-Athlete of the Year.

After high school, Craig continued with his success on the soccer field. He was a three-year starting goalie for Medaille College where he led his team to an overall record of 50-7-6 including a 20-1-1 record as a senior. That year, Craig's shutout percentage was the fourth highest in all of Division 3 soccer. Craig was a two-time All-Conference selection, was named a D-3 soccer.com Regional All-American, and an NSCAA Adidas 3rd Team Scholar All-Region member. After college, Craig played semi-pro soccer in both the NPSL and CSL. He has also coached women's college soccer at Medaille College and Alfred University.

Craig is the son of Michael and Alice Yanni. He resides in Arkport with his wife, Trisha, and their daughter, Adelyn.




