The HHS Girls Varsity Basketball Team has brought home their first sectional title in Hornell's history. Under the coaching staff of Jimmy Dagon '13 and Chris Clark '98, Hornell (#3) defeated the top seeded Dansville in a score of 54-47 to win the Class B2 title. Playing with three freshmen and an eighth grader on the floor, the Raiders played with maturity and grace to defeat the Mustangs at

Rush-Henrietta High. Their loan senior Madelyn Moore scored 11 points while eight-grader Reagan Evingham lead the team with 13 points. Selena Maldonado and Reagan Evingham were named to the Section V Class B2 All-Tournament team while Madelyn Moore was named MVP. The Lady Raiders ended their season with a 15-9 overall record as they fell to Waterloo 48-38 in the class B1 vs B2 Playoff game. Way to Go!

Over the years, our family gatherings were filled with tales of fun, and sometimes mischief, in the halls I walk through today. Superintendent's Letter

Dear Hornell High School Alumni,

The 2022-2023 school year has been an exceptional one for the Hornell City School District and our students! With the restrictions of the pandemic behind us, we have been able to come together once again to offer our students the academic and extracurricular programs that have been part of our proud tradition for many years. From filled bleachers at sporting events to packed auditoriums for concerts and plays, our children are experiencing everything that makes a Hornell education both comprehensive and extraordinary!

This past December, the community said "yes" to large-scale classroom improvements to the Intermediate School, as well as to upgrades to the seventh and eighth grade classrooms in the High School. The approved project also includes replacing our turf and reconstructing our tennis courts that have been unusable for the last few years. We are grateful to the community for supporting our students with these facility upgrades. Our Board of Education is committed to this work and to realizing our ten-year master plan. There will be more to come on future phases of this master plan in the coming year.

In the Fall of 2022, the district launched a comprehensive needs assessment. Through this process the district gathered feedback from parents, community members, students, employees, and the Board of

Education. This data will shape the next steps in our strategic plan and will help inform our budgeting decisions and trajectory for the next five years. 


The Big Elms

The Big Elms was first established as a small hot dog stand in 1925. Cliff and Marjorie Anderson sold the restaurant to George and Jan Fawcett in 1954. At that time, George had been working part time at the Elms for the Anderson family while employed as a police officer with the City of Hornell since 1946. Janice was working as a schoolteacher at



Lincoln School. When the Fawcett's took over the Big Elms, it consisted of only a lunch counter and a small dining area known as the Colonial Room. They had the idea of creating a more elegant and larger property to hold an increased number of guests. They started by expanding the Colonial Room, and in 1970 they added the Victorian Room, a cocktail lounge and banquet room. The opening of the Victorian room was the start of a more formal dining area, and George and Jan were helped by their sons Chuck and Frank, as well as Chuck's wife Christina, where they successfully owned and operated the business for 35 years. In 1989, the restaurant was sold to Doctor Majur Balji.

The Elms is still talked about for their home-made corn bread sticks which were baked in a cast iron baking pan with molds shaped like small ears of corn. The bread was then added to each breadbasket and immediately sought after amongst the other dinner rolls. Paired with amazing entrees like surf and turf, soups like beef barley, and deserts like graham cracker cream pie, the Big Elms was a hot spot. Also known for their holiday decorations, their huge St. Patrick's Day tent party (which just may have started Hornell's celebration), and its ability to host large parties and get togethers. From proms, to wedding receptions, to George working the carving station, the Big Elms was a staple on the north end of town. Many know that a large fire took the original half of the restaurant and the Colonial Room, but the Victorian Room is lucky to be home to the long time Argentieri family owned Italian Villa today.

The Sunset Inn

First owned by Angelo and Josephine Marino Cartella and the Randazzo family, the Sunset Inn served great food for nearly 100 years. The Sunset was popular for entrees such as meatballs & sauce, prime rib, lasagna, and chicken parmesan. The Sunset is also remembered for its "house" salad dressing. An Italian dressing with just the right amount of garlic that wasn't overwhelming, but left you with the great taste long afterwards. From day one, to it's last, a Sunset pizza was never a disappointment. Whether it was for Sunday brunch, a baby shower, a pre-prom dinner, or a couple tunes on the jukebox, the Sunset was a popular destination for decades. People fondly remember long time owners Jimmy and Carolyn George stopping by a table to chat or bringing large meals to families who had lost a loved one in the neighborhood all free of charge. The George's embodied the giving spirit and connected to others like family. That rings through each story shared. The Stewart's also carried on the Sunset legacy for a number of years, and lasty the Davis' for its final 14 years until 2020.

Could this be the famous Sunset dressing? Try it and see! Add just enough oil (75% vegetable oil 25% olive oil) to cover the lettuce.

With 2/3 oil, 1/3 vinegar ratio, add 1/3 wine vinegar.

Add approximately 1 tsp fresh minced garlic for every serving of salad being made.

Salt & pepper and stir to mix thoroughly.

Add the tomatoes and the salad is complete.



The Ponce De Leon



We spoke with Suzanne Roselli Piatt, class of '83, the granddaughter of Cap "Cappy" and Virginia Roselli who owned the Ponce de Leon Grill. Suzanne told us that Cap and Virginia owned the downtown Ponce in the 50's and early 60's. When urban renewal was tearing things down, they then built the larger restaurant on Webb's Crossing Rd. As far as food goes, people loved Ponce pizza and "Homemades" like pasta. Suzanne's husband Bill Piatt (the couple own Savor Vineyards and Wine's in Arkport) especially loved the grilled ham and provolone cheese sandwiches along with Cap's famous minestrone soup made with homemade noodles. The Ponce hosted countless weddings and parties, club meetings, and large dinners. Also, many bands played the venue like Scorpio, The Rogues, Moondance, and many more. Suzanne's mother used to come home from waiting tables and talk of

meeting well known politicians including Bella Abzug and G. Gordon Liddy. Walter Taylor of Taylor Wines and later Bully Hill Vineyards was a regular and would tell stories and draw on napkins (picture the labels on a Bully Hill wine bottle). Cappy passed away in 1992, and the restaurant closed after Virginia passed in 1996. Suzanne noted that there were so many wonderful and colorful patrons and employees that memories and stories could last a lifetime.



Ricky Gillespie Mobley '74

Ricky Gillespie Mobley is a 1974 graduate of HHS where he excelled in football and track. Rick won the Golden Helmet MVP game award in '71 and' 72. He



started as a defensive end, cornerback, safety, and wingback. He was a senior tri-captain, but an injury cut short his final season after 3 games. He was one of the captains of the track team in '74. He excelled in track in the long jump, 220, and 80 relay. He set the school record in '74 for the 220. He was part of the 880-relay

team that set the school record at the NY State Meet in 1974 coming in second in a photo finish. Rick continued his football career as a safety at Hamilton College and started all 32 games during his 4 years. While there he set the record for most career interceptions, most interceptions in a season, and longest interception return for a touchdown at 103yds. He tied for second in the nation in Division 3 his junior year for interceptions. He was invited to try out for both the Dallas Cowboys and Seattle Seahawks but declined.

Rick graduated from Hamilton College in '79 with a BA in History, from Gordon Conwell Theological Seminary with an M. Div. in '82, from Boston University Law School with a J.D. in '88, and from Trinity Bible Camp; College Seminary with a D. Min in '97. Rick met Toby Gillespie at seminary, and they married shortly thereafter in 1980. They worked as co-pastors for 39 years together serving churches in Boston, MA and Cleveland, OH. They have 4 children, Samantha, Anita, Keon, and Sharon. They served as foster parents for many children for 25 years. Their goal has been to bring the love of Christ into the lives of others. Rick retired from his role as pastor at the end of 2021. He's still active as a lawyer.

Brandon Pyer '06

Brandon Pyer is a 2006 graduate of Hornell High School. He excelled in Cross Country as well as the Indoor track and Outdoor Track and Field teams from 2002-2006. Brandon was an integral part of both teams, helping Hornell win 3 Outdoor Sectional Championships and 1 Indoor Sectional Championship. Brandon earned a total of 13 Varsity letters.



Brandon competed in cross country during his high school years and was awarded Genesee Regional Livingston All Star from 2003-2005.

Brandon's Indoor Track achievements in 2003 included the individual 1000 meter run with a time of 2:40 earning him the status of Sectional Champion. He was also a member of the 4x4 and 4x8 relay teams. They broke the school record with a time of 8:18 at the State Competition.

In 2004, the 4x4 and 4x8 relay teams earned Section V titles. Also, in 2004, Brandon qualified in the 1000 meter allowing him to compete in the State Championships held at the Carrier Dome in Syracuse. Brandon received 2-time All-League honors while competing in Indoor Track.

Brandon competed in Outdoor Track and Field for five years. From 2003 to 2006, Brandon was a member of the 4x400M and 4x800M relays which advanced to the State Championships four times. The best finish during this period was in 2004, placing 2nd in the 4x800M relay. In 2006, Brandon's success continued as he won the Class B 400M Hurdles.

In 2005, Brandon was selected to represent Western New York in the Empire State games competing in the 800-meter outdoor run.

Brandon currently resides in Canisteo NY and is a local contractor.









Austin Dwyer '10

Austin Dwyer is a 2010 HHS graduate who excelled in football, wrestling, and track. He earned a total of 11 varsity letters throughout his high school career.

In the sport of football Austin was a two way starter playing running back and cornerback in the 2008 and 2009 seasons. He was a two-time first team LCAA 1st team all-star. As a senior, Austin served as a team captain and led Hornell to



its first ever state championship title in 2009. During that season Austin was awarded a number of awards because of the record-breaking season he and his team had. He rushed 319 times for a total of 2,836 yards and 37 touchdowns during his senior campaign. Austin broke the Section V Single Season Rushing record, Hornell High School Single Season Rushing Record, and the school record for most touchdowns in a season. He broke the NYS Tournament Record for most rushing yards in a game with 399 yards in the NYS State Semi-Finals versus Westhill HS. In the playoffs he was awarded the following awards: 2009 Section V Class B Offensive Player of the year, Section V Class B MVP, NYS Far West Regional Most Valuable Offensive Player. NYS

West Regional Most Valuable Offensive Player, NYS Semi Final Most Valuable Offensive Player, and NYS Class B Championship MVP. He was selected to play in the Section V Eddie Meath all-star game and the Upstate vs Downstate All-Star game. At the conclusion of the 2009 season Austin earned 1st team all-state honors and was chosen as the NYS Class B Player of the year and All Greater Rochester Player of the Year. He finished his high school career with 518 carries 4,381 yards and 54 touchdowns, 87 tackles and 4 interceptions.

Austin was a 5-year starter on the wrestling team and was a team captain his freshman-senior seasons. In his senior season he broke the school record for most wins in a career with 180 victories. He had a career record of 180-36. Austin was a 2008 and 2009 All Greater Rochester selection. He was a 3x LCAA Champion at 135, 145, and 152 pounds and was awarded most outstanding wrestler as a senior. He was also a 3x Sectional Champion at 130, 140, and 145 pounds. In 2009 he was awarded the Section V 3B Most Outstanding Wrestler. He was a runner up at the Section V State qualifier in 2008 and 2009. Austin earned two trips to the New York State Championships once as a wild card in his junior year at 145 pounds. As a senior, he punched his ticket to Albany by winning the Section V State Qualifier at 152 pounds. He then went on to place 4th at the New York State Championship tournament at 152 pounds.

In the sport of track Austin was a 3-year letter winner competing as a sprinter in the 100, 200, and 4x100 relay. He earned multiple dual meet victories and top 6 finishes at invitationals while anchoring the 4x100 relay. As a senior, he qualified for the Section V Meet of Champions.

Austin was selected as the 2010 Rochester Press Radio Club Male Athlete of the Year, 2010 Livingston County Male Athlete of the year, 2010 Hornell Evening Tribune Award, Ernie Weyand Work Ethic Award Winner, and James Dagon Award Winner.

Äfter graduating from Hornell, Austin attended Alfred University where he was a 4 year starter as a running back on their football team. As a freshman he was selected as the Empire 8 Rookie of the year and the ECAC Rookie of the year. During his freshman campaign he also broke the single season rushing record, rushing for 1,416 yards helping his team to the Elite 8 of the NCAA tournament. He helped lead his team to 2 ECAC championship bowl wins and ranks 4th all-time in rushing yards. Austin was a 3X Empire 8 All Star Earning 1st team honors twice. He served as a team captain in both his junior and senior year.

Austin earned a bachelors in psychology and masters degree in school counseling from Alfred University.

Austin is the son of Mary Kay and Joseph Dwyer. He is employed as school counselor at LeRoy Jr-Sr High School and coaches wrestling and track and field. He currently coaches football at McQuaid Jesuit High School and is a Section V Wrestling official. Austin resides in Rochester, NY with his fiancé Kerri Bellavia.

Issac Spike is a 2010 graduate of Hornell High School where he earned 10 varsity letters in football, track, and swimming. From 2008-2009 Issac started on

the Hornell football team. In 2008 he started as a defensive end and a tight end after transitioning from offensive tackle. Issac was awarded 1st Team All-County. Issac started as a defensive end and offensive tackle in the 2009 season where he was awarded 1st team all-county, 1st team All-State, and All Greater Rochester.



Issac played in the Eddie Meath All-Star game and the New York State All-Star game. Issac played a big part in the first state championship win over Nanuet. Issac was named the offensive lineman of the game in the Section V Championship. From 2006- 2009 Issac was a diver for Hornell's swim team being undefeated in diving in the 2008-2009 season while placing 2nd in Sectionals and 3rd in State qualifiers as a junior. Issac did shot-put in the 2009-2010 indoor track season where he broke the indoor shot-put record that had stood from the 90's. Issac competed in shot-put and discus from 2008-2010 outdoor season. Issac went undefeated in the 2009 and 2010 regular season for shot-put where he won the Section V Championship for shot-put. Issac was named 1st team all-county is 2009 and 2010.

Dylan Dunn '11

Dylan Dunn is a 2011 graduate of Hornell High School where he starred for the Red Raiders on the basketball court, football field, and baseball diamond. Dylan received 9 varsity letters, won four sectional championships, and accumulated two state championships.



As a sophomore, Dylan quickly assumed a major role for the Hornell varsity basketball team. On the hardwood, Dylan was known both for his physicality at the rim and explosiveness around the perimeter. Dylan's dominant presence earned him Livingston County Super 18 and second team Great 8 recognition, while also being named a First team Livingston County All Star.

Dylan first appeared on the football field as a Junior after transitioning from his role as a goalkeeper on the Hornell varsity soccer team. It was evident that Dylan would assume an important role for the Gene Mastin led football team. He was named a starter on the offensive and defensive side of the ball as a safety and wide receiver, while also performing the kicking duties for the Raiders. He set the Hornell High School record for most PATs/extra points. His contributions were immediately felt and his leadership earned him the Captain title as a senior. Dylan was a critical member of the 2011 and 2012 sectional and state championship teams and was recognized as a two time Livingston County All Star for his successes on the field.

Dylan starred for the Red Raiders each spring on the baseball diamond where he found a home behind the plate as a sophomore. Dylan paced the team with a .500 batting average as a junior and senior while accumulating seven home runs and forty five runs batted in. In 2011, Dylan lead the Raiders to a Class B sectional championship, earning tournament MVP and named Section V Class BB Player of the Year, the first Hornell player to earn such honors since 2003. In addition to local honors, Dylan received third team All New York State honors.

Dylan's high school success earned him an opportunity to play baseball at Hagerstown Community College (Maryland), where he earned First Team Allhonors. Dylan Region concluded his baseball career as the starting catcher for the Division I Saint Bonaventure Bonnies where he started 86 games and slugged seven home runs over the 2014 and 2015 seasons. Dylan currently resides in Indian Rocks Beach, Florida.

Dominic Scavo '12

Dominic Scavo is a 2012 graduate of Hornell High School where earned nine varsity letters in Football, Basketball, and Baseball, while accumulating three sectional championships and three New York State championships.

Dominic initially appeared on the baseball diamond as a Freshman where he paced the team in home runs while pitching and playing multiple positions around the infield. As a senior, Dominic assumed the duties as the top starting pitcher while also being a big bat in the middle of the Raider batting order.

Dominic first suited up for the Hornell varsity basketball team as a sophomore. Beginning his junior year, Dominic paced the Red Raiders averaging nearly 11 points/game with a team leading 8 rebounds per game. As a result, Dominic was named second team Great 8. Dominic followed up his junior campaign again averaging double digit points and leading the team in rebounding. While Dominic spent the majority of each game guarding the most physical player on the opposing team, he complimented his physicality with the ability to shoot the ball from the perimeter and beat defenders to the rim off the dribble. As a result of his success on the hardwood,



Dominic was again recognized with first team Great 8 honors while also receiving honors as a Livingston County All-Star.

Finally, Dominic spent every August through November on the Football field where he quarterbacked a Gene Mastin led football team to three state championships and became arguably Hornell's most decorated quarterback ever. As a sophomore quarterback, Dominic led the Red Raiders to an undefeated 13-0 record and the school's first-ever NYS Class B Championship after defeating Nanuet High School in the Syracuse Carrier Dome. Dominic was named a team captain as a junior and went on to be named the Most Valuable Player in the New York State Championship after throwing for one touchdown and rushing for two others enroute to the schools second straight 13-0 season and state title. As a senior captain Dominic passed for 1,336 yards with 15 touchdowns while rushing for 15 more while securing the schools third straight undefeated season and Class B State Championship. In the final game of his career, the Red Raiders defeated Croton-Harmon by a 22 - 6 final after a huge second quarter scoring outburst started by his 24-yard touchdown run.

Upon the conclusion of his senior football season, Dominic had accumulated a perfect 39-0 record, three sectional titles, and three Class B NYS Championships. Over those three seasons, Dominic threw for 3,523 yards and 46 touchdowns (71% completion percentage) while also scrambling for 979 yards and 35 scores on 182 attempts; all while only playing the first half of most games. Dominic earned recognition each season for his success on the gridiron, including honors as New York State Class B Player of the Year (2011), First Team All New York State (2010 & 2011), First Team All Greater Rochester (2010 & 2011), All Greater Rochester Player of the Year (2011), and as a Livingston County All Star (2009 - 2011).

Concluding his high school sports career, Dominic received the Hornell Evening Tribune Award given to the most decorated Hornell Athlete and was honored as the local athlete of the year at Hornell Sports Night.

Dominic graduated from Alfred University and went on to Stetson University College of Law in Gulfport, Florida where he received his Juris Doctorate, graduating with honors. Dominic currently resides in Saint Petersburg, Florida, where he practices law for one of the nation's largest law firms




















The Songbirds of HHS

If you graduated from high school fifteen years ago or more, you may have heard the phrases Treble Choir or Jazz Choir and wondered about them. You might even know about Show Choir. You may have also heard the phrase "Gold" award a lot. In fact, you probably have

heard it at least 45 times. That is all due to the hard work and dedication of the HHS Musical Choir groups under the direction of Chris van Leeuwen. Since 2008 Mr. van Leeuwen, better known to the kids as "CVL" has evolved the current choral program into what it is today.

When Mr. van Leeuwen began his teaching career as the Director of Vocal Music, he learned of the legacy he was taking over from the one and

only Pati Piper. He knew he had to pick up where she had left off and could still feel the force of her presence in the school and the reputation she had built. She laid the groundwork, but he knew he had to continue that legacy and needed to go beyond the reputation that she had created. He has proven to have done that, and more.

If you have attended any of the choral performances in recent years you have probably only seen the back of his head as he magically waves on his ensembles to entertain the audiences. So, who is Mr. Christopher J. van Leeuwen?

Chris van Leeuwen has been the 7-12 Director of Vocal Music for the Hornell City School District for the last 16 years. He received his Bachelor of Music Education from Nazareth College where he studied choral conducting under Dr. Mark Zeigler and later attended the University of Scranton earning a Master of Science in Educational Administration.

Mr. van Leeuwen directs the Hornell Junior High Choir, Treble Choir, Senior High Choir, Show Choir, and Jazz Choir. He also teaches music electives in theory, history, film, and the cognitive neuroscience of music. Under his direction, Hornell ensembles have competed in various cities including New York City, Boston, MA, Chicago IL, Annapolis, MD, Washington D.C., and

Philadelphia, PA receiving 45 Gold awards in 15 years. His choirs have received prestigious performance invitations to the Segerstrom Concert Hall in Los Angeles, Carnegie Hall in New York City, and to Normandy, France for the 73rd anniversary of the D-Day landing. His auditioned choirs regularly give 25+ performances a year including gigs for the Elmira Jackals, Rochester Red Wings, and with the rock band FOREIGNER in 2010.

Mr. van Leeuwen has received multiple Outstanding and Excellence in Music Direction Awards from the Theatre Association of New York State (TANYS) for the annual Hornell High School musical productions. He has guest-conducted honors festivals for various organizations including the Steuben County Music Teachers Association, Cortland County Music Teachers Association, and Genesee Valley School Association. He has also guest lectured on the social and psychological benefits of music education at Alfred University.

He is currently the PreK-12 Music Department Chairperson, serves on the board of directors and is a regular vocalist/actor for the Hornell Community Theatre (HCT), is a member of the New York State School Music Association (NYSSMA), and has been recognized by Marquis Who's Who in America for Excellence in Music Education.

Chris currently resides in Hornell, NY with his wife Danielle $^{\circ}05$ and his two beautiful daughters Shea and Aria, and is a diehard follower of the New York Mets. #LGM

evolution of the current choral program has come to be there" about. When CVL started at HHS he realized there was an enormous amount of talent within the student body. He knew immediately that he could successfully take the students to competitions and could win awards. During his first year as choir director, he traveled with the students to Boston to compete in a North American Music choral competition that is offered in a variety of cities throughout the United States. It was in this competition that the students brought home their first Gold award. It is at these competitions that students learn to hone their craft by receiving feedback from judges that are selected from esteemed institutions.

Bringing home their first Gold award gave the choral groups the momentum they needed to be successful. As Mr. van Leeuwen says "success breeds success". As students began to see the success of the choral competitions, more students want to join the program. While a lot of credit can be given to Mr. van Leeuwen, he credits the kids with the successes they have earned. As a teacher, he enjoys seeing students that might not normally decide to do choir, sign up and join their goaloriented ensembles. He takes pride in watching the students grow and become more confident in their skills as they want to be pushed to do better. "Kids make friends with other kids that they might not typically interact with because they don't sit at the same lunch table or aren't on the same sports team." He equates his choral groups with a sports team sighting many parallels to the expectations of success. There is always turnover, it's skill-based, there is a lot of preparation, and it takes hours of practice to be able to compete. The one difference he says is, "There are no time-outs. You can't stop a performance to fix a mistake. Every student has to trust each other, and they care about what everyone else is doing and how they perform." He believes the student body is loaded with talent and the Hornell community embraces the students and their activities. He knows the students' performances reflect his efforts, but the students still must deliver. They must keep the audience's attention for as long as they have asked for it. He claims he "just points them in the right direction". He always tells the students "My back is always to the audience; you are the ones who have to face them". He never questions the value of what they are doing because they always make him proud. He loves what he does because he "gets

Having over 200 students 7-12 the HHS Choral program consists of 5 different choral ensembles. Senior High Choir which included students 9-12, Junior High Choir which includes students 7-8, Treble Choir which is predominantly girls 9-12, and then both Jazz Choir and Show Choir which requires the completion of a successful audition in June of each school year. All choir groups earn the students one academic credit a year. While most of the groups are predominantly female, other schools are envious that the HHS choir ensembles tend to have more males than other districts.

Before Mr. van Leeuwen came to Hornell, the choirs only performed 2 concerts a year. Usually at Christmas time and in the spring. Due to the addition of some of the choir groups they now perform a minimum of 4 performances a year: A Pops Concert (October), a Winter Concert (December), their competitions in March, and a Spring Concert (May). With 4 performances a year, that only gives them an average of 10 weeks to prepare for each performance.

Due to his specialized training in vocal Jazz, it was Mr. van Leeuwen that has introduced the Jazz choir to HHS. At competitions, the Show Choir competes as a Chamber Choir and these two groups only meet once a week for practice outside of school hours. Their talent and level of success speak volumes when they bring home Gold awards. All the ensembles (except Junior High) travel to compete each year for competitions and the Show & Jazz Choirs (Select Choirs) travel extensively throughout the Hornell community and surrounding areas. This past year they performed 14 concerts in just December alone entertaining local organizations and senior citizen homes.

Since 2008 the HHS choir ensembles have been bringing home multiple Gold awards a year from various competitions. The students have traveled every year except 2020 when they were slated to travel to Washington DC two weeks after the world shut down. They have traveled to various cities throughout the country such as New York City, Boston, Philadelphia, and Chicago to name a few. This year they traveled again to the New York City on their 15th trip to increase their Gold award total to 45. Of the 15 trips they have taken to competitions, 10 of those trips earned them the honor of Best Overall Choir.

Spring 2022

BASEBALL



The Varsity Baseball team finished the regular season with a record of 14-4 and a LCAA Division 1 Title with a division record of 7-1. They defeated Bishop Kearney in their first sectional game before falling to Batavia 5-4 in the semi-finals, finishing the season with an overall record of 15-5. Highlights of the season included sweeping both Bath and Livonia to win the division and finishing the regular season on a 10-game winning streak. Offensively the team was led by Nick Oyer, Wyatt Argentieri, and Gates Miller. Nick finished the season batting .333 with 12 RBI's and 8 extra base hits. Wyatt had the highest batting average at .339 with 18 runs scored. Gates Miller hit .333 and led the team in both total hits and runs with 20 of each. The pitching staff as a whole did a phenomenal job all season and held their opponents to a batting average of just .205 while posting a team ERA of 2.48. Cullen Haley went 5-1 on the mound with an ERA of 1.6 while striking out a team high of 68 batters. Griffyn Baker finished the season 3-2 with a 2.38 ERA and struck out 62 batters in 32 innings. Matt McKee posted 5 wins on the mound in both starter and relief roles. Nick Oyer, Cullen Haley, and Wyatt Argentieri were all selected to the Livingston County All Star Team.



SOFTBALL



The Hornell Girls Varsity Softball team finished with an 8-9 Record. This gave them a second-place finish in the LCAA Division 1 and eventually bowed out in the Semi Finals to the #1 Seed Batavia 4-3. The improvement these girls made as a team, not only in their play but in becoming a close-knit group that had each other's back was great to see and a lot of fun to watch from a coaching perspective.

Tierney garnered Exceptional Senior Status, While Maddie Reudenauer, Allyson Buckley and Ireland Harrison were named to the Section V Class B2 All-Tournament Team.

FOOTBALL -

Despite being outmanned in both numbers and experience, the 2022 Red Raiders battled through every game and never quit. Opening the season with a win over Vertus despite having 20 active players was a highlight of the season, as well as coming back from a 22-0 halftime

deficit to battle eventual Sectional champion Attica to a one score



He was, and will forever be, a memorable player in the "anti-dump" movement when New York State tried to install a nuclear waste facility in Allegany County. Although he was arrested for his advocacy in May of 1989, Gary continued to be an advocate against nuclear waste in Allegany County.

Gary is survived by his wife, Mary Jane (Girondo) Lloyd, son, Timothy Lloyd, daughter, Hilarie (David Walker) Lloyd, sister, Sheila (Randy Smith) Lloyd and five grandchildren, Amanda, Annie, Benjamin, Alistar and Aurora.

Gary touched the lives of many people over the course of his life as a teacher, friend, father, brother, son and grandfather. He genuinely cared about the members of his community. He will be greatly missed by all of those who knew him.



G. Thomas McCarthy '49





Tom retired from the Air Force in 1972 out of Griffiss AFB in Rome, NY. He took pride in many of his recommendations that led to improvements in aviation safety. In 1985, he was asked by the National Air and Space Administration to transfer to them and rejuvenate their Aviation Safety Program. He retired from NASA in 1997 as the Director of the Aircraft Management office. Tom was a member of the International Society of Air Safety Investigators (ISASI), starting in 1981 and served as treasurer from 1996-2012. He was awarded the Jerome F. Lederer Award from ISASI in 2007, in recognition of his lifetime contributions to air safety.

In his spare time, he was a volunteer senior docent at the National Air and Space Museum at Udvar-Hazy in Virginia. He

was living the dream, surrounded by iconic aircraft, and talking about them with people that shared his passion.

Tom is survived by his daughters, Colleen (Jeff) Tarkett of Longmont, CO and Kelley McCarthy of Avondale, AZ. He has 6 grandchildren and 10 great grandchildren. He is also survived by his sister Michelle McCarthy Lewis of Hornell, NY and numerous nieces, nephews, and cousins.






Donald Howard Spittler


