President's Letter


Dear fellow Alumni,

Union Square Park

On Thursday, Nov 2, 2023, Mayor John Buckley cut a ribbon for the city's newest yearround attraction at the intersection of Seneca and Genesee streets, next to Community Bank. The park's size is slightly under an acre and was designed to pay homage to Union Park, a popular downtown fixture that was lost to urban renewal programs in the early 1970s. Union Square features an in-ground fountain, an amphitheater with a raised stage covered from the elements, concrete walkways, benches, monuments, lighting, and green space. Many Hornell residents got their first close look at the

park during the ceremony when a monument to Hornell Police Sgt. Daniel J. Swift was dedicated. More than 200 people attended the dedication.

"Union Square Park is just the beginning of a series of public improvement projects funded by the DRI that will further enhance the vibrancy of the city's downtown and serve as a catalyst for future downtown investments." according to Buckley. He called the park "versatile" with the ability to hold many types of events and that the city is currently working with Hornell Partners for Growth to establish a summer concert series starting in 2024.

It's hard to believe that another year has passed so quickly! I would like to begin by thanking all of you for the integral part you play in the Hornell City School District family. Your ongoing support and engagement in our district has been invaluable and has made a significant impact on the lives of our students.

This year we kicked off our fall events with the Junior High Musical Into the Woods and the Senior High production of Fractured Fairy Tales. Each and every one of the students who participated brought a unique set of strengths to the production to create something truly special. We have an amazing student body and staff who are committed to our musical arts program and cannot wait to see your talents shine in the years to come.

Reflecting on the past academic year, I am beyond proud to share all of the amazing academic accomplishments that our students have achieved. For the first time in many years, we sent students to participate in the Steuben County Youth in Government program which provides opportunities to explore local government, career interests, and leadership experiences in civic engagement, tour county facilities, presentations from county leaders, meet legislators, etc.

Our students, once again, were fierce competitors at the DECA Regional Competition. Amaya Hoffman, a first-year DECA member and Senior, secured 1st Place. Russell Gage, also a first-year DECA member and Senior, claimed 2nd Place, while Matthew Robinson, a second-year DECA member and

Sophomore, secured the 3rd Place spot. Students in Calculus classes participated in the W. Varick Nevins III High School Mathematics Competition at Alfred University. Of the approximately 150 students competing, six awards were given out. Hornell's Logan McGregor was awarded a cash prize along with a \$6000 scholarship for his 3rd place in the Senior Division and Nicholas Gray was awarded a cash prize for his 2nd place finish in the Junior Division.

Additionally, we are proud to announce that the National Junior Honor Society Induction welcomed 40 new members and, for the second year in a row, we have all 9 of our Varsity teams qualify as Scholar Athlete teams.

Finally, 31 Senior students achieved the status of 2024 honor graduates. Norah Foreman earned Valedictorian and Vivan Smith and Kadience Gollnitz were announced as co-Salutatorians. Congratulations to all of you for your many years of hard work and dedication to your academic success!

Graduation will be held this year on Friday, June 21st at 7 pm. Please join us as we see our graduates close one chapter and begin another!

How are Scholarship **Recipients Chosen?**

The Hornell High School Alumni tradition strives to encourage and support life-styles that have strong work ethics, public service, and academic achievement by rewarding students who exemplify these characteristics with recognition and financial assistance for their education.

A silent committee serves at the pleasure of the President of the Alumni Board. This group is always kept confidential. It may come as a surprise but this is truly a secret committee and never discussed. Board members don't have a clue! A meeting is called by the Superintendent of Schools and the HHSAA President.

The silent committee, school officials, teachers, and guidance counselors meet for the first time. Every senior is offered an opportunity to fill out an application.

The Superintendent provides a detailed resume of all students: class ranking, financial need, student activities, desire for higher education (school choice), cost, student character, personality, and potential

All selections are final. No records leave the school and resumes of the students are returned and kept confidential.







Irene Vincent has been chosen editor-in-chief of the Volcano, monthly publication of Hornell High School, for the year 1945-1946. Patricia O'Connor has been appointed assistant editor; Jack Rohan, sports editor; and Francis Vogt, photography editor. The editors for next year have been members of this year's staff.

Adviser for next year is Miss Mary Jean Tremaine, member of the English department, who will succeed Mrs. Robert Shoemaker, present Volcano adviser and teacher of English IV and journalism, who is leaving to join her husband at Norfolk, Virginia. A graduate of Wellsville High School and Alfred University, Miss Tremaine will teach English III and journalism.

The school paper was organized in 1921 under the supervision of Miss M. Jane Harrower, vice-principal and guidance director. Miss Virginia Leahy took over the advisership of the Volcano in 1941 and continued through 1944 when Mrs. Shoemaker was appointed adviser.

Adam Eason, a 2009 graduate from HHS, has made a splash in the Hornell area over the past few years with his culinary endeavors. Adam is the owner and operator of a Tex-Mex restaurant in Hornell known as Biggie's Tex-Mex Bar & Grill located at 66 River Street. Along with this, Adam owns and operates two food trucks that travel the area satisfying the taste buds of customers with delicious offerings.

Adam was not always in the restaurant industry, after graduating from HHS, Adam obtained his associate degree and then eventually obtained his BBA in Financial Planning; after a few years in the Financial Planning/ Insurance field, he went back to college to go into teaching. It was during the COVID-19 pandemic that Adam decided to dabble in the food business; he started a small cattery known as" Throw A Dog A Bone BBQ." In 2021,

Adam decided to take time off from teaching and purchased the empty shell of a trailer; in the end, he refurbished this into a food truck. Adam says his inspiration for this came from Railhead Brewery owners (and fellow HHS graduates) Mike McCumiskey '99 and Dave Woolever '99. After months of preparation, Adam opened Biggie's food truck on September 8, 2021, and from there on Adam has experienced much

success. With the food truck being a hit, Adam saw an opportunity to expand to a brick-and-mortar business when the 66 River Street building became available. On June 6, 2022, Biggie's restaurant opened for the Hornell community and surrounding areas to enjoy. Since then, Biggie's has been one of the busiest restaurants in Hornell that is open 7 days a week and is the only restaurant in Hornell to serve late night.



In addition to the restaurant, Biggie's has a full bar with some of the finest tequilas. Currently, Adam employs about a dozen staff – including a General Manager and Kitchen Manager; during food truck season (YES, Adam still operates his two food trucks), the staff can increase to 15-16. With all of his success, Adam remains true to his core and takes part in various philanthropic activities that support the Hornell community. Adam looks to continue the growth and success of Biggie's as he looks to make enhancements at the current River Street location (inside and outside) but is also possibly looking into expanding to a second location. Susan Hunt Cieslak '75

Susan was nine years old when she first sat behind the plate. That started her career as a catcher, and she became interested in other sports. Susan was catching in her team's first game in the inaugural year of the Cinderella Softball



League which started in Hornell in 1966. The Able Cable team won the league championship in 1967, 1968, and 1969. Susan played on the Cinderella All-Star teams in 1969, 1970, and 1971 and they won the Cinderella World Series Championships in 1970 and 1971. During those early years, Susan developed her love and skill behind the plate, but she also learned other positions and developed into a very good hitter and base runner.

Susan's freshman class was when the ninth grade was brought up to the Hornell High School building. Her love and success in softball gave her the confidence and skills to participate in other sports. As a freshman, she lettered in and softball.

soccer, basketball, and softball.

Susan played and lettered in soccer, basketball, and softball in her sophomore, junior and senior years. She was challenged by being part of the last defense as the center fullback on the soccer field. In basketball, Susan was tough on defense as a guard and aggressive on offense. She was captain of the team and received the MVP award in her senior year. The softball teams had undefeated regular seasons in their junior and senior years. Susan always felt at home behind the home plate and aggressive at the plate. She also participated

in field hockey, but at the time this sport didn't have a full schedule of games. Susan showed her school spirit off the fields and courts by being a member of the Girls' Athletic Association, Varsity Club - Lettermen, Women Libbers, French Club, AFS (Student Exchange Program), and Pep Club. She was inducted into the Honor Society in her Junior Year. During the summers between each of her high school years, Susan played on the Princess Softball League for girls aged 14-18. They won the Princess World Series Championship titles in 1973 and 1974.

Susan's high school athletic career was at a time when sports and opportunities were improving for girls. Teams were getting better uniforms, equipment, and fields and more time on the courts. Up until her senior year, the High School Yearbooks didn't include pictures or information about girls' sports. Not having much newspaper coverage or record keeping didn't reduce the value of the skills and achievements that she developed and displayed in the three sports she lettered.

She attended and cheered for the boys' sports whenever she was not practicing or playing at one of her own games. She volunteered at the concession stands at the stadium and in the school during the games. During high school, she worked at several jobs including babysitting.

From 1972-1975, Susan owned a Registered Palomino Quarter Horse which she rode for pleasure and competition in both English and Western Style. In local competition, she won several ribbons in her age group.

After graduation, Susan was an assistant coach for the Princess Softball team for several years. She also bowled in the Women's League for several years.

Susan graduated from Alfred State College and maintained her license as a Registered Record Technician for 30 years working at St. James Hospital for 27 years and 3 years for Catholic Charities. Her interest in sports continued throughout her life. Along with her husband, Joe, they continued to watch sports on TV and Hornell High games. With their children, Joey, Angela (Tom), Andrea (Richard), and grandchildren, McKenna, Kylie, Jaxson, Charlie, and Sammy as well as friends and family they continue to keep the spirit of sport and competition alive through games such as horseshoes, volleyball, badminton, bocce ball, swimming, darts, corn hole, and ping bong, kickball, baseball/softball, and basketball. Susan is looking forward to the arrival of a grandson in December.

Erin Buchanan is a 1993 graduate of HHS where she earned a total of 10 Varsity letters in basketball, volleyball, and softball.

Erin was an integral part of the HHS women's basketball program. As a 4-year starter and team captain, she led the team in scoring each season. She was the first female in Hornell High School history to score 1,000 points in



her career for the Red Raiders, while playing in the Sullivan Trail Conference against powerhouse schools like Corning West, Southside, Horseheads, and Elmira Free Academy.

Erin was named to the Sullivan Trail Conference All-Star team in 1991, 1992, and 1993. She was invited to play in the Ronald McDonald Senior All-Star Game her senior year and was named to the All-Greater Rochester 1st Team in 1993. Erin averaged 16 points per game during both her junior and senior years while scoring a career-high 30 points against Corning West.

During the summers of 1992 and 1993, she played for the Western New York Empire State Games basketball team competing against the best female athletes in New York State. In addition to basketball, Erin was a 3-time varsity letter winner in both volleyball and softball. She was a member of the 1993 Section V Class BB Sectional softball team.

Erin went on to play college basketball for the Geneseo Knights, a division 3 program that was ranked #1 in the country. The team went on to make appearances in the NCAA Tournament in 1994 and 1995, finishing in the Elite 8 in 1994.

Erin is the Northeast Market Leader for Mercer, a global consulting firm. She resides in Victor, NY with her son Jake and their dog Maggie.

Matt Stewart '05

Matt Stewart graduated from Hornell High School in 2005, earning 8 varsity letters in football, basketball, and baseball. He was a member of three Section V Championship teams, two for baseball and one for football, and two state final four teams for baseball and football. His senior year, he



helped lead the Raiders to 3 Livingston County Division I League Championships in football, basketball, and baseball, while earning the Sports Night Co-Athlete of the Year and the Hornell Evening Tribune award for the class of 2005 Male Athlete of the Year.

Matt started for the varsity football team as a wide receiver his junior year, earning first-team All-Livingston County and leading the league in receiving yards. Most of his accomplishments came during his senior season as he helped the 11-1 Raiders win the Section V Class B championship and reach the program's first final four

state championship in the school's history. As a senior, Matt led the league in receiving yards and kick/punt returns, which allowed him to be selected to the All-Livingston County 1st team, All-Leader 1st team, Livingston County News Super 22 team, All-Greater Rochester honorable mention, and selected to play in the Ronald McDonald Eddie Meath All-Star football game.

As a two-year starter and a three-year varsity basketball player, Matt helped the Raiders go 10-0 in Livingston County and earn the school's first-ever league championship. He was a two-time Livingston County first team member and Evening Tribune Spectator Great 8 team member his Senior year. In 2003, Matt was selected as the Most Valuable Player for the first Wegmans Christmas Tournament and was the starting guard for the Livingston County exceptional senior team in 2005.

As a varsity baseball three-year starter, Matt helped the Raiders win a Section V Class A and Class B Championship, two Livingston County Division I Championships, and clinch a State Final Four trip in 2003 and a Western Regional trip in 2004. Most of Matt's success was on the mound for the Raiders as he never lost a game as a starting pitcher in both his junior and senior years and recorded multiple seasons with an ERA of around 1.30. Matt was a 2-time first-team All-Livingston County, Livingston County Exceptional Senior, and All-New York State team selection during his 3 years with the Raiders.

Post-graduation, Matt attended Alfred State College and played both football and baseball for the NJCAA Division II Pioneers. Matt went 18-3 on the mound in 26 starts, throwing 12 complete games. His 18 wins and 12 complete games rank first in program history during the Pioneers NJCAA era. Matt was selected 1st team all-region and All-WNYAC which earned him a full tuition scholarship to St. Bonaventure University to play in the Atlantic 10 conference. Matt played one full season in his junior year with the Bonnies, helping the team to their 3rd conference playoff berth by starting on the mound for big conference wins against Xavier, UMass, St. Joes, Richmond, Dayton, and Temple. He also started on the mound and helped the Bonnies post major program wins against Boston College and West Virginia before suffering a career-ending injury in the fall of his senior year.

Matt graduated from St. Bonaventure with a degree in Business Administration and currently works as a Cloud infrastructure IT Project Manager for Mastery Logistics. He resides in Charlotte, North Carolina with his wife Kristen and two daughters Mackenzie and Serena.

Zachary Bacon graduated Hornell High School in 2013, having received 12 Varsity letters and being recognized for his athleticism in multiple sports across

the board. Zachary excelled in football, wrestling, track & field, and baseball. Zachary won multiple awards as well as set records, making his career one to be remembered. As a freshman, Zachary started as a noseguard on the HHS football team. As he excelled in football, he went on to continue as a starting fullback and middle linebacker from his sophomore year through his senior year. Zachary also led the team as captain in his junior and senior years. In 2013, Zachary started as a tailback his senior year making him a 4-year starting player. In 2011, Zachary was awarded Class B Defensive Player of the Year and Most Valuable Player in the state finals. Zachary was also awarded Class C Player of



the Year and Section V Player of the Year in 2012. In 2013, Zachary was named the Athlete of the Year at the Knights of Columbus Sports Night. Zachary's success in his football career is reflected by his respectable records: Zachary had 383 rushes for 2,283 yards, 20 touchdowns, and averaged 5.97 yards per carry. Zachary had 24 receptions for 426 yards and 7 touchdowns. This was an average of 17.75 yards per reception. On defense, Zachary had 377 tackles, 22.5 sacks, 1 fumble recovery, and 3 defensive touchdowns, one of which was an interception returned for a touchdown, putting his overall touchdown total at 30. He averaged 94.25 tackles per year. Zachary's impressive football record stands at 51-1. Zachary's phenomenal performance assisted the team in winning 3 back-to-back state championships in 2009-2011 and runner-up in 2012.

Aside from football, Zachary's additional focus was wrestling. Breaking records, winning titles, and receiving awards are just a few of his accomplishments during his time on the HHS wrestling team. In 2010, Zachary received the John Gemmell Award in which he was first recognized for his talent in wrestling. He received this award for 3 consecutive years. In 2011, Zachary's talents gave him a glimmer of what his future in wrestling would hold when he was named a Section V State Qualifier Runner-Up in the 215 lb. weight class. Zachary received the Tony Batone Award in 2011 and 2012. Zachary was also named Hornell Wrestling's Most Outstanding Wrestler in 2011, 2012, and 2013. In 2012, Zachary won the Section V Class 3B Championship for the 220 lb. weight class, sending him on to become a Section V Champion State Qualifier for his weight division. Zachary then won the title as New York State Runner-Up. That same year, Zachary was recognized for his talent and was named Most Outstanding Wrestler for the 220-weight class for All-Greater Rochester. Zachary continued to shine as he went on to become LCAA Champion in 2011, 2012, and 2013. In 2012, the HHS Wrestling Century Club awarded Zachary for his greatness. In 2013, Zachary dominated his senior year, winning the title of Section V Class 3B Champion for the 220 lb. weight class, following him being named as Section V Champion State Qualifier. Zachary went on to win the New York State Championship in wrestling, finishing up his senior year with a perfect record of 44-0. Zachary gave up only 5 points that year. Zachary was named third in All-Time Hornell History Wins with 152 wins under his belt. He also holds the record at HHS for the fastest pin in 6 seconds.

As Zachary was a comprehensive athlete, he kept fit throughout the year, playing for the HHS Baseball Team and throwing for the HHS Track and Field in discus. In 2010, in the positions of pitcher and catcher, Zachary assisted the HHS Baseball team to victory as Section V Champions. Although Zachary had no experience in track & field before his junior year, he still managed to earn two titles in discus his senior year. In 2013, Zachary won the LCAA Championship in discus with a personal record of 141'0". He continued to impress as he also earned the title of State Qualifier Runner-Up in discus.

Zachary finished his High School Sports career with 4 State Championships, 7 Sectional Championships, and 8 LCAA Championships. Upon graduating in 2013, Zachary went on to attend Alfred University where he started as nose guard for

the Alfred University football team. He continued to excel in football during his 2-year career in college. Zachary began his career in Corrections 5 years ago and is currently employed by the New York State Department of Corrections at the Attica Correctional Facility. He is the son of Kimberly and Larry Bacon and brother to Kristi Canty and Colleen Clair. Zachary resides in hometown of Hornell where he lives with his girlfriend Dana and their puppy Gertrude Louise.

Brendan Buisch '13

Brendan Buisch is a 2013 graduate of HHS. He was a member of the Football, Basketball, and Baseball teams, where he won a Sectional Championship in baseball, basketball, and 3 in football, as well as 2



State Championships in football. To the best of our records, Brendan is the only athlete in the history of HHS to win a sectional title in baseball, basketball, and football. He played varsity baseball his sophomore year and was the first baseman on the 2011 Sectional Championship-winning team.

Brendan was a pivotal piece for the basketball team his junior year, as they made a run for a Sectional Championship, but truly became an impact player his senior year. He was a team captain, and his size and physicality played a huge

role in the team securing their first Sectional Championship in 25 years. Brendan will be remembered as one of the strongest rebounders and shot blockers in school history. Brendan was named Class B MVP, as well as being selected First-Team Spectator Great 8 (along with teammates Julian Reinhart and Jimmy Dagon) and Seventh-Team All-State

Football was where Brendan excelled, playing safety and wide receiver. He was a member of the 2010 State Championship team and recorded his first varsity reception in the State Championship game his sophomore year. In his junior year, he recorded 3 TDs, while playing a big role in Hornell's 3rd straight State Championship. It was during his senior year that Brendan stood out. Leading the team with 12 receiving TDs and playing safety. Brendan was selected as the Offensive MVP of the State Championship game in a losing effort. Brendan was named First-Team All-State and is the only receiver in HHS history to be named First-Team All-State. He also garnered First-Team All-Greater Rochester and First-Team Livingston County All-Star.

After graduating, Brendan went up the road to Alfred University where he went on to have one of the most prolific receiving careers in the program's history. He was the team's leading receiver in his sophomore, junior, and senior seasons. In 2016, Brendan was a captain on the Empire 8 Championship-winning team that finished in the Elite 8 of the DIII Men's Championship, the best finish in school history. That same season, Brendan set school records for Receiving TDs in a Single Game (4) and Receiving TDs in a Single Season (16) and finished the season with 1056 yards receiving, three yards shy of breaking the single-season record. He was selected as a First-Team Empire 8 All-Star, ECAC North First Team Offense All-Star, and D3football.com East Region Third Team All-Star. He left Alfred with the second most receiving TDs in program history (32), as well as being in the top 5 of all major receiving statistics. He earned his Bachelor's Degree in Psychology from Alfred University.

Brendan currently resides in Raleigh, North Carolina with his wife Katelyn, where he works as a Sr. Human Resources Business Partner for a Software Company. Brendan also has the honor of sharing a space in the HHS Hall of Fame with his late Grandfather, John Tobin, who was one of his biggest fans throughout his years of sports at HHS.

Damian DeMarco graduated from Franklin & Marshall College in 1985, closing out an 8-year athletic career that included a junior high District 11 championship, several high school league all-star selections, two trips to

the PA state cross-country championships, 12 collegiate letters in cross-country, indoor and outdoor track, and selection by his collegiate peers for the 1985 William J. lannicelli Track and Field award for leadership, dedication, and unselfishness.

While earning his Master of Arts in Teaching at Boston College in 1986, Damian began his coaching career, volunteering for the Watertown HS, MA girls' track & field team.

Damian began his English teaching career at Cutler Ridge MS, in Miami, FL. While there he coached



Damian and his wife Laura moved to Western NY in 1991. Initially, he coached cross-country, swimming, and boys' track & field at Alfred-Almond.

Damian began teaching full-time at Hornell High School in 1992, and after 1996, he was named head cross-country coach. The team switched from STAC to LCAA and finally as independent during Damian's career. Numerous athletes earned all-star status, ran in Division 1, 2, and 3 programs, and have since earned entry to the HHS Athletic Hall of Fame.

Damian also served as boys (1996-2001) and girls (2001-2022) head outdoor track and field coach. Both boys' and girls' teams also had many all-stars and individual sectional champions. The boys were Section V team champions in 1999 and 2001; the girls were Section V team champions in 2005, 2007, and 2011. While the girl's head coach, athletes established school records for multiple events in 2004-2008, 2011, 2014, and 2022. Again, many athletes continued their careers in Division 1, 2, and 3 programs and several are now HHS hall-of-famers and successful high school coaches.

As a coach, Damian always stressed the pursuit of personal bests, a philosophy he acquired from his coach at F&M (Coach "I" correctly maintained that when athletes work to be as good as they can be "winning takes care of itself.") Rather than focusing on overall team records, make the season last as long as possible, with the ultimate goal of participating at the NYSPHSAA championship meets. Damian is proud to have accompanied cross-country runners to States in 1996, 1998, 1999, 2004, 2005, 2007, 2010, 2013-2017, and 2019, boys track and field athletes in 1997, 1999-2001, and girls track and field athletes 2004-2006, 2008-2012, 2014, 2017-2019, and 2022.

Damian retired in July 2022, after 30 years teaching at HHS. His family includes three HHS alumni: Devin (2010), Dominic (2011), and Deia (2013). Damian remains active in sports as a NYS track and field official and in music with fellow former teachers Tim Berardi and Ed Belin. He also travels extensively with his wife Laura, hiking through places of natural beauty.




Spring 2023

BASEBALL



The 2023 Hornell Red Raider Baseball team had an excellent season. The year started with the departure of former Head Coach Jake Kenney and JV Coach Joe Flint taking over varsity at the beginning of the season along with Assistant Coaches Mike Bassage and Pat McHale. The team went 14-6 overall and 8-4 in the Livingston County League. The Red Raiders had only 5 returning players from the 2022 season. The 4 Senior Captains were Shortstop Shawn Rose, Outfielder Wyatt Argentieri, Catcher Jake Ponticello, and P/ OF Gates Miller. The team was strong at home going 9-3 at Maple City Park. SOFTBALL





GIRLS TRACK & FIELD -



The Girls Varsity Outdoor Track team had a successful year despite a low number of athletes. While dual meets were not our strong suit, we made up for that at invitationals. We often placed in the top 3. For the Hornell Invitational, the girls placed second, and the boys and girls combined overall took first. The girls also placed third at the Sectional Championships. We had a lot of personal bests throughout the season, as well as some broken records.

Our standout senior, Elaina Flaitz, continued her dominating success out on the track this season. Lainey was undefeated in the high jump throughout the regular season. At Sectionals, she placed 1st in the high jump, 2nd in the 400 hurdles, and 4th in the 100 hurdles. She also placed 2nd in the 400 hurdles and 3rd in the high jump at the State Qualifier meet. Senior Makayla Kriner continued to improve in her events and was only a few inches short of throwing 30 feet in shot. Unfortunately for senior Alexis Patrick, she suffered an injury that took her out for the rest of the season. Freshman standout, Selena Maldonado, worked her way up the leaderboard in multiple events and broke the long jump record while doing so. At the Sectional meet, she placed 2nd for the long jump, 3rd for the triple jump, and 4th for the 200m dash. We had a powerhouse of 8th-grade girls. Ella White, Riley Harwood, Silvia Carretto, and Elisa Bodin have all already left their imprint on the Girls Track and Field program. At the Sectional meet, Ella placed 5th in both the 100m and 200m dash, Silvia placed 4th in the 800m run, and Elisa placed 6th in both the 1500m and 3000m run. The girls' 4x100 relay consisting of Riley, Selena, Ella, and Elaina placed 2nd, and the girls' 4x400 relay consisting of Riley, Ella, Silvia, and Elisa placed 5th.

The season came to a successful end with five girls advancing to the State Championship meet. Elaina Flaitz ran and placed 5th in the 400 hurdles, Selena Maldonado competed and placed 12th in the long jump, and the girls 4x100 relay team consisting of Elaina, Selena, Riley Harwood, and Ella White ran and placed 9th at the State Championship meet. Relay alternate Silvia Carretto was also in attendance.

BOYS TRACK & FIELD



The 2023 Red Raider Boys Track and Field Team proved to be a much stronger Invitational team than a dual meet one. While the Red Raiders finished 1-4, with two very close defeats, they were the John Reed Invitational Champions, finished 3rd at the 25-team Hornell Invitational, and took 4th at Wellsville Spring Day. Paradoxically, the team lacked the depth to compete one-on-one but had the talent to take on a field of 20 teams. The Boys were also named a NYSPHAA Scholar-Athlete Team for the 2022-2023 year.

The '23 Red Raiders were a potent combination of veterans, led by LCAA and Section V All-Star, Brennan DeLany ('23), Ramsey Dean-Prince ('23), and Jacob Phillips ('24), and a talented group of first-year athletes, led by Wyatt Argentieri ('23), Kellan Crowe ('25), and Austyn Gollnitz ('25)

Wyatt Argentieri and Kellen Crowe were the team's top sprinters in the 100m and 200m. They also combined with Austyn Gollnitz, Ramsey Dean-Prince, and Xzavier Patrick ('24) to form a potent 400m relay team. Kellan, Austyn, and Jacob Phillips were an outstanding 1-2-3 combination in the jumping events all season. LCAA Champions and League All-Stars were: Wyatt Argentieri (100m and 200m), and the 1600m Relay team of Wyatt, Jake, Kellen, and Nathan Wise.

But the 2023 Outdoor Track and Field season belonged to five-year veteran and three-year team captain, Brennan Delany. This Spring, Brennan broke three school records: 110M High Hurdles (14.73), Triple Jump (46' .05") also a Section V Meet record, and Pole Vault (13' 7"), and he is number two all-time in the Long Jump (22' 5.25"). He is the LCAA Champion and League All-Star in the Pole Vault, 110m High Hurdles, Long Jump, and Triple Jump, and was the LCAA All-Star in the High Jump. He won four events at the Section V Championship Meet: the 110m Hurdles, the Long Jump, the Triple Jump, and the Pole Vault. He also won the Section V, Class B Devin Snyder Award as the Outstanding Male Field Athlete of the Meet. At the Section V State Qualifier, he won the 110M Hurdles, Triple Jump, Long Jump, and Pole Vault. Brennan is the first male athlete in the history of Section V Track and Field to qualify in all four events for the New York State Track and Field Championships. At the State Meet Brennan medaled in three of his four events: 2nd in the 110m Hurdles (5th in Federations), 2nd in the Triple Jump, and 5th in the Pole Vault, and he placed 12th in the Long Jump.

With a strong, core group of returning athletes (and plenty of promised new talent), the Red Raider Track and Field team is on the right "track."

GOLF



The Varsity Golf Team was led by McKenna Donlon (Senior), Kenny Graham (Senior), Rachel Holbrook (10th Grade), and Alex Norton (8th Grade). Kenny Graham posted the lowest score of the season for the Raiders at the Bath Country Club. Alex Norton also had an impressive season with the lowest overall average qualifying him to play in the LCAA County Tournament at the Livingston Country Club on May 8th.

The Red Raider Golf Award went to McKenna Donlon for her leadership and consistent play. McKenna has been on the golf team since her 7th grade year and involved in youth golf since the age of seven. Congratulations to McKenna and her teammates for their accolades this season.

The 2023 Hornell Red Raider Cross Country team was small with many first-year runners. Our lone senior, Norah Foreman battled nagging injuries throughout the fall campaign but was able to finish the season competitively at the Steuben County League Championship Meet and the Section V Championships. The Girls were also named a NYSPHAA Scholar-Athlete Team for 2023-2024.

Constant improvement from all the younger runners was a season-long highlight as well. Sophomore Ella Foreman led the way for this year's "drop squad."

For the Boys, Junior Nathan Wise was the season's sole runner, epitomizing the "loneliness of the long-distance runner. But Nathan persevered. He ran a personal best at the McQuaid Invitational (20:21), finished 19th at the Steuben County Meet (20:51), and improved his seed at Sectionals, finishing 40th in 19:29.7, dropping almost a full minute off his previous best.

With steady improvement and solid performances, Modified runners Molly Berry, Maya Buckley, Hannah Jacobs, and Kassidy Mullikin proved that the future of HHS Cross Country is looking up for the Lady Raiders. They will join two-time Steuben County All-Star and Section V top-five run Freshman Elisa Bodin. Elissa was dominant in the SCL competition. Elisa placed 7th at the County Championship Meet and followed that with a personal best 5K time (20.23) and 3rd place finish at the Section V Championship Meet at Letchworth State Park. The Red Raiders went 8-0 and won the LCAA Division 1 championship. They also claimed the Wayland Cohocton showcase over Corning and won the Dan Barkley classic title over rival Wellsville.

The team was composed of two seniors, five juniors, and four sophomores. It was led

by its two senior captains Gennaro Picco and Xzaiver Patrick. The team had several big victories over Livonia, Wellsville, and Corning. They also won on senior night against a talented York squad.

Gennaro Picco finished off his stellar high school career being the All-Time leading scorer in school history with 1,608 career points at Hornell and a total of 1,837 overall. Gennaro averaged 22.9 points per game, leading the Red Raiders. He also led the team in assists and steals. PJ Picco led the team in rebounding and was 2nd on the team in scoring, averaging just over 14 points per game.

Next year the team will bring back nine players including returning starters PJ Picco, Aaron McInerney, and Wyatt Evingham. We look forward to the future and hope we can build upon what we did this year.

WRESTLING



The Varsity Wrestling team had a competitive '23-'24 season. As a young squad (11 total 7th & 8th graders, 4 freshmen, 2 sophomores, 4 juniors, and 2 seniors), the team finished 3rd in the Livingston County Division 1 League dual meet standings, picking up key league wins over divisional opponents Livonia, LeRoy, and Avon-Geneseo, and finished as the 7th-place team in the LCAA Championships with 5 place winners (three finalists, two LCAA champions in Logan Snyder, 170, and Dylan Cullen, 285, with Nolan McGregor, 124, finishing second) while also tacking on 5 individual place winners in the JV LCAA tournament. In addition to his LCAA title, Logan Snyder was also a recipient of the LCAA Wrestling Senior Scholarship award.

In the Class B Sectional Tournament, Hornell finished as the 6th place team, with 5 individual place winners (two finalists; McGregor, 124, and Snyder, 170). All 5 placers qualified for the State Qualifier tournament, 'Super Sectionals.' At Supers, Nolan McGregor and Logan Snyder finished

4th at 124lbs and 6th at 170lbs, respectively, to lead the team, while junior Dylan Cullen (285) narrowly missed the podium, falling one win short. Junior Braydon Fouser (215) and 8th grader Joe Kilmer (101) each picked up wins in the State Qualifier tournament as well. Notably, junior Alexis Knickerbocker finished as the runner-up in the Section V Girls Ranking Tournament and was on the list as an alternate selection for the Girls Wrestling State Invitational.

The team was led in the individual win column by Logan Snyder (34 wins), Nolan McGregor (30 wins), and Dylan Cullen (29 wins) on the season. Nolan McGregor also joined the 'century club' in his senior season, crossing 100 career victories, while compiling a career record of 130 wins and 41 losses.

GIRLS BASKETBALL



The Hornell Girls Varsity Basketball team second-straight won its sectional championship in 2023-2024, defeating Dansville in the Section V championship game. The Red Raiders finished the year with an overall record of 21-4 which set the Girls' basketball program record for most wins in a single season. The success of the team was heavily reliant on the group mentality, hard work, and selflessness that the entire team displayed throughout the year. Throughout the season, all five starters averaged in the double -digits for scoring, and there were 7 different single-game leading scorers. This year's championship run was the 2nd in program history.

Picco Breaks HHS Basketball Point Record!

There was quite a buzz in the air inside the Red Raider gymnasium as the boys' basketball team played host to Pavilion. The buzz was surrounding senior Gennaro Picco as the captain of the Raiders took to the court hoping to become the Hornell boys' basketball program's all-time leading scorer. With 3:30 left in the opening quarter, brother PJ Picco lofted the ball toward the basket high above the rim, Gennaro rose above the defenders and just missed the dunk but was able to skillfully guide the ball in for the record-setting bucket. Gennaro Picco became the all-time leading scorer in Hornell High School history with 1,376 points, breaking the record set in 2006 years ago by Scott Young with 1,375 points.

"Tonight was a great night in HHS basketball history," said coach Scholes. "Watching 'G' work every day for four years has been nothing but awesome. I don't think he's ever missed a practice. He goes hard every day, and he's so humble. He's been a joy to coach, not only because of his talent but also his willingness to work. This will be a night that, in 30 years he will look back on and remember how much fun he had with his teammates, family, and friends."

This is not a small feat. Picco is only the fourth boy's basketball player in Hornell's long history to eclipse the 1,000-point mark. He has done so in only four years at Hornell High School, one of which was a COVID-19-shortened season, while the other

three 1,000-point scorers played their 8th-grade year as well on varsity. Picco's 8th grade season on varsity came at Houghton Academy. He has scored over 1,600 points between the two schools.

He is currently carrying a 100.41 GPA while never missing a full day of school. He also plays soccer and baseball but will go down as one of the best to play basketball at HHS.






Remembering a former HHS teacher!





Local HHS Alumni, Siblings, and Cousins share a glimpse of Agricultural Success!

Current Smith's Stock Farms, Inc. Owners/Operators/supporters and HHS Alumni: Lowell Smith '62 (Bonnie Smith-retired Hornell 2nd grade teacher), Dale Smith '69 (Lucy Fox-Smith), Chris Passero (Heather Smith-Passero '91) and children, Aaron Smith '94 (Lisa Fucci-Smith '90) and son, Andrew Smith '95 (Beth Bixby-Smith) and children, Lindsey Smith Bailey '00 (Dave Bailey).

In 1832 (YES, almost 200 years ago!) the tradition of farming began for the Smiths, on land nestled in the hills between Hornell and Howard. This multi-million-dollar dairy operation is known today as Smith's Stock Farms, Inc. and is owned, operated, and supported by its 6^{th} , 7^{th} , and 8^{th} generation, most of whom are Hornell alumni. The business has grown

substantially over the past 50 years. The total herd size is approximately 1,400 cattle (calves, heifers, and cows). Four years ago, the Smiths made a huge progressive and costly investment and installed 11 DeLaval VMS robots to milk the cows. These robots allow each cow to be milked to her individual needs and capacity. A robot is available to all cows 24/7. This means she can voluntarily enter an open robot at any time, day or night, and be milked! Milking is at her convenience. Smith's Stock Farms allocates thousands of dollars yearly



toward the comfort and health of our cattle. Along with their own knowledge, they work closely with veterinarians, nutritionists, calf specialists, hoof trimmers, milk inspectors, and equipment technicians to provide the best for their animals. Comfortable, clean, healthy, well-nourished cattle produce the best and most milk! Smith's Stock Farms ships approximately 53,000 pounds of high-quality milk DAILY! They own and lease about 2700 acres to grow corn and alfalfa to feed the herd. In addition to what they grow, they buy other nutritional components to supplement the cows' diets. Nutrition is of utmost importance when it comes to milk production. Countless hours are spent in the fields during the spring, summer, and fall to prepare, grow, and harvest crops. When the weather is right, and the ground and crops are ready, the workdays are literally from before sunrise to after sunset!

The Burns Family Farm LLC, just a hill away, is managed by Jonathan Burns, a nephew/cousin to the Smiths. He is the seventh generation in agri-business, graduated from HHS in 1994, and then continued his education at Cobleskill, graduating with a 2-year Ag Business degree. In 1998, Jonathan joined his parents, David Burns and Carol Smith Burns, in the day-to-day operations of the farm. Domenica Cavalucci, a 1994 graduate of HHS, became Jonathan's wife in 2002 and has been part of the farm since. They have two children, Micah (19) and Karis (15), the eighth generation, and a large part of taking the farm into its future success. David Burns, now 84, is still active on the farm and in ag education. Carol, a 1960 HHS graduate, is also an active part of this community as well as a help on her home farm and family farm. The Burns Farm milks 500 cows three times a day and raises 500 replacements from birth to two years when they enter the milking herd. Their crop land encompasses 2,000 acres on which corn, hay, oats, straw, and more are grown and harvested for the feed and comfort of their herd. This requires ten full-time and several part-time helpers, including their children, who thrive in agriculture, animal care, mechanics, and machine operation.

In general, family farms are on the decline and being challenged by things beyond their control: government overreach, strict and costly regulations, increased operating expenses, high taxes, and weather just to name a few. The vast majority of businesses in the US can increase their fees to offset expenses. This is not so with dairy farming. A milk co-op has control over the price of milk that is paid to farmers. Farmers cannot adjust the price of milk to cover grossly increased operating expenses (think fuel, machinery, parts, labor, seed, milk hauling, general maintenance, electricity, insurance, etc.) These farms contribute tens of thousands of dollars to the Hornell school district through taxes. They help support local businesses in our area and contribute to the livelihood of community members through their need for products, services, and several specialized professions.

Agriculture is a challenging yet rewarding career. New life is witnessed every day with the birth of calves and the sprouting of seeds. We see the spunk of young calves and the curiosity of cows. The sounds of the big tractors starting back up after a few month's hiatus, the smell of freshly turned dirt after the long winter, and the aroma of fresh-cut hay bring forth a sense of pride. Proud that we can be good stewards of the land and continue what many generations started so many years before us. It has required sacrifice and commitment from family members, dedicated employees, and many friends who have been a source of support and encouragement. Agriculture is a declining occupation, but such a necessary one. It is what feeds, fuels, and clothes our country. Take a minute to truly think about that and say a prayer for the future generations who commit their lives and legacy to agriculture and our small town.

He loved the game of golf and this is a perfect way to pay tribute to such an amazing hero. Zach always made moments very special and cared deeply about people and chose to live a life of a very giving person. He joined the Marine Corps. in 2008 and lived the Marine Corps. Motto, which stands for Honor, Courage and Commitment – that defines Zach to a tee. Zach was deployed in December 2009, and on January 24, 2010 he stepped on an IED (improvised explosive device) that took his life. His older brother Nate (Class of 2005) set up a scholarship fund and the golf

tournament the day after Zach was killed to make sure that Zach's name still lives on. His younger sister, Grace (Class of 2017) helps

with the tournament as well. It is important to our family to keep Zach "alive". So many of our family and friends volunteer their time. Thank you to all who help make these tournaments such a success, it is so hard to believe that we have done this for 14 years. Winners of the tournament in 2023 were Marty Butler, Scott Carroll, Dan Roser and Brennan Canty.

The proceeds from the golf tournament go to the Zachary D. Smith Memorial Scholarship fund. Every year, a Hornell High School senior is chosen from the essays that are written and turned into the guidance office. This scholarship is valued at \$4,000 payable annually while the recipient is enrolled in college or the military. This year the award was given by the family to MacKenzie McDaniels. She is attending Alfred University, and her major is Education. The family, along with the help of the Athletic Director, chose Madelyn Moore for the scholarship for an Athletic Award that is presented in Zach's name. The value of this award is \$500. Madelyn is majoring in Exercise Science at Brockport. We wish them the best of luck in their futures. Fellow Marines Visit the Hometown of Our Fallen Soldier

In July last year we had a big surprise with eight of Zach's Marine buddies and their families. Zell, Zach's bunkmate at Camp Lejeune sent me a message in January of last year and said he was coming home for the 4th of July and he meant coming to Zach's home. He called me in March and talked about it again, so I wrote the dates on my calendar. I didn't hear from him until July 3rd when

he sent me a message saying he would be in Hornell the next day, July 4th. I thought about him coming, thinking that he would be with Jesse (who lives in Canaseraga, yes 20 miles up the road). I wanted to make sure that I had plenty of food, so I got busy in the kitchen, so I was somewhat prepared. I was really looking forward to catching up with Zell and seeing what was going on with his life as he lives in Florida.

The next morning, I received another text saying I will meet you at noon at Zach's Post Office. Zell has been to Hornell a couple of times and he surprised us to come to Zach and Anne's wedding, and then he did come up after we lost Zach in 2011.

On July 4th, I went to the Post Office at noon, and when I arrived, I saw a lot of people around the flagpole, and recognized a couple of them. I got out of my car and realized that Zell had organized a trip to come to Hornell to see Zach's hometown. They drove from Canaseraga and Schenectady NY, Wisconsin, Florida, Kentucky, XXX.

After the Post Office visit, we all came back to the house and had a day of fun: swimming, eating, laughing and so much reminiscing. The boys talked about the day we all lost Zach. It was very comforting to hear them talk it out with each other and the details of that day. Although we have heard different stories and conversations from many of them, it was different this time. Even when they were talking, their eyes were really like going back in time and picturing every detail. I believe this was good for all of

these special Marine brothers. This visit showed them how we have lived, how we have survived, and how we have kept moving forward in our lives in a most positive way.

We also visited Zach's grave and spent more time reminiscing. We shared some tears and laughs.

One of the Marines, Stephen, also was the producer of "Once a Marine", this is a documentary that shows the experiences of some of the Marine brothers in their lives while in the Marines and after getting out of the Marines. In 2016 Stephen came up and visited Zach's hometown and interviewed us to learn about how and where Zach lived, and there are clips in the film of Zach as well.

Two of the Marines we had not met yet in person, but have talked to them before. It was great to meet them in person. Five of them have visited in the past at different times within the 14 years. When we went to Dover to do the Dignified Transfer the day after Zach was killed, the Casualty Officers informed us that we will always be a part of the US Marine family. I wondered how as our connection was gone, we had nothing more to do with the

Marines. I couldn't have been more wrong. We have met so many of Zach's Marine brothers and we also have met so many people that are tied to the Military and have learned this is a brotherhood with a deep bond. It was obvious that Zach was well loved before they lost him, and they all still love and miss him. They told so many stories of Zach. We will treasure them forever and I am sure that they have no idea how much closure they brought to our hearts.

Thank you, Darren, Geoff, Zach, Zell, Kyle, Jacob, Jesse and Stephen, for a most memorable visit, and bringing more closure to the dreaded January 24, 2010 day which changed not only our lives but all of his Marine brothers' lives as well.
