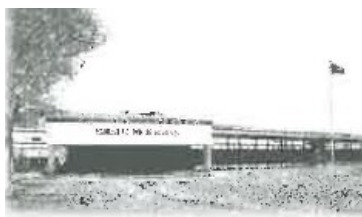

A Hornell Landmark is Getting a Facelift



Public safety is driving a project that will see the removal of all the granite siding tiles on the historic Tuttle and Rockwell building at 103 Main St. By most reckonings, the tiles have been in place for more than 60 years, giving the immense four-story structure a distinctive look in the center of Hornell's downtown business district. What replaces the old siding is still to be determined, but the former department store's new facade "will look good" and fit the surroundings, according to Mike Nisbet, executive director of the Hornell Industrial

Development Agency, the owners of the building.

Nisbet said a couple of "very low" siding tiles became detached when workers were using jackhammers during sidewalk replacements as part of the Streetscapes, Alleyways, Wayfinding, and Public Art project earlier this year. "Our big thing right now is to get them down, get the facade of the building firmed up so we can open the sidewalk. When the weather changes, we will look at what's there and decide what we are going to do with the facade," he said. Many are curious in anticipation of what is to come of the newly renovated exterior of a well-known city landmark.

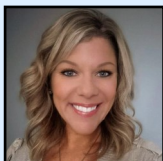
Allison Roberts '12

Greetings from Hornell High School!

Dearest Alumni!

I hope this message finds you well. As we reflect on another incredible year, I am honored to share the latest updates and achievements from our school community. Your continued support and connection to our alma mater inspire us, and we take great pride in celebrating the lasting impact you have made beyond our halls!

This year began on an exciting note as we welcomed the 6th graders into our building as construction at Intermediate was in full swing. Seeing these young scholars in our building has been a true joy and serves as a reminder of how quickly these high school years pass!

This year has been filled with many academic, extracurricular, and athletic accomplishments. This year 31 students were inducted into the National Junior Honor Society and 25 students were inducted into the National Honor Society. Additionally, we have 18 graduating seniors earning the distinction of Honor Graduate including Valedictorian, Alaina Raish, and Salutatorian, Christopher Hoyt.

Additionally, our year has been filled with many enriching experiences that have inspired and challenged our students. Field Trips this year included traveling to local businesses to learn employability skills, a choir trip to Virginia Beach, visits to City Hall and the Public Library, the Corning Museum of Glass, and the Susan B. Anthony House, among others. We have also been able to bring dozens of speakers into our classrooms in collaboration with the Career Development Center including Mathon Noi the co-founder of Building Minds in South Sudan and authors Steve Sheinkin and Tony Weaver. Our students also did an excellent job in the Junior High Musical *Freaky Friday*, the fall performance of *Ghosts in the*

Machine, and Spring Musical *Hadestown*. We also held our first Junior High Spelling Bee and sent off Veena Narra and Abbas Kazmi to the regional competition. Finally, Mia Nasca, Quinn Mauro and Calem Striker all placed at the DECA regional competition.

Athletically, our student-athletes were on fire!!! Boys and girls varsity soccer teams won sectionals and the girls went on to the state final four, Girls indoor track won sectionals for the first time in HHS history, and the girl Varsity Basketball team won sectionals and went on to compete in the NYSPHSAA Final four! Individual records were set by Elise Bodin who qualified for the state cross country meet, Calem Striker who set a new school record for the 50 free at times of 21.87 and qualified to compete in states, Lillian Hoyt, Jordyn Dyring, PJ Picco all entered the 1000 point club for basketball, Brynna Wilkinson broke the school records for the 100-meter run in indoor track, and the 4x200 relay team of Ella White, Mayleigh Martin, Delainey Thompson, and Selena Maldonado managed to break their own school record 4 times this season.

As the year comes to a close, we are anxiously awaiting the beginning of renovations on the A gym. We are looking forward to new facilities and a facelift for our building. Graduation will be held this year on Friday, June 27th at 7 pm. Please join us as we celebrate the class of 2025!

Dear Hornell High School Alumni,

The 2024-2025 school year has been another exceptional year for the Hornell City School District. This summer, we were excited to learn that our school has once again been recognized as a New York School of Distinction for our student-athletes. To achieve this prestigious recognition, 100% of our varsity teams had to qualify and receive scholar-team awards. Our students continue to shine both in and out of the classroom, excelling at all grade levels and across all disciplines. From winning sectional championships and competing at the state level in sports to achieving top honors in music and academics, we couldn't be more proud of our students and faculty!

We are also thrilled to witness the transformation of the Intermediate School through our ongoing construction project. By the end of next year, the school will have undergone an almost complete update, with a new addition finished and classrooms fully remodeled. In the summer of 2025, we will begin the demolition and reconstruction of our A gym. This new gymnasium will be larger, with more seating and a second-floor walking track that will be open to the public. The gym is slated for completion and ready for use in the 2026 winter

History in the Making

It may have been a tough loss, but with amazing effort and resilience, the Hornell Red Raider girls' basketball team has officially made history for the Hornell community. Not only was it Hornell's first appearance at the final four, but it was also the first time they had made it to the finals for the state championship.

The Red Raiders were defeated by Cold Spring Harbor (Section VIII), 54-50, in the NYSPHSAA Class B championship game at Hudson Valley Community College in Troy.

Hornell led by as much as 17 in the second quarter and 15 in the third, but were outscored 22-8 over the final eight minutes as the Seahawks completed the comeback.

Jordyn Dyring led Hornell with 16 points and five rebounds. She was the only Red Raider to reach double figures. Mia Nasca added nine points, all on 3-pointers. Selena Maldonado (eight points, six rebounds) and Raegan Evingham (six points, 11 rebounds) were other major contributors. A'jonay Hawkins added six points, and Payton Bentley chipped in five.

"They all erupted after we came out after (the semi-final) game ... I had to duck into the bathroom because I got teary-eyed because it meant so much," Dagon said. "The whole community is like that, though. Hornell is a special place, and I'm proud to be from there."

The girls' varsity squad has many returning players next season, so their hunt for a state championship is far from over. While it may not have been the outcome that everyone wanted, the team has made the community proud.

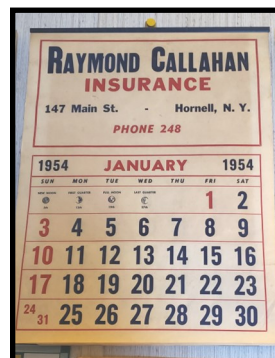
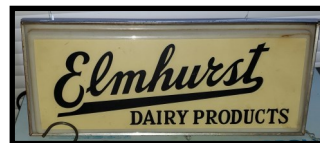


"One Man's Trash is Another Man's Treasure"

She worked for many years at Super Duper until its closure and then at the local Wegmans for several years. Once her kids were grown and gone, (Sherry Talbett Arnault '93 and Rob Talbett '95) Yvonne needed a hobby to take up her free time. Her brothers Joe and Stan introduced her to 'dump digging'. For those who remember there were two dumps located in the Crosby St. area. One closed in the 30's and one in the 50's. The 37th annual Sports Hall of Fame ceremony and dinner was held on the evening of September 21st at the Main Place in Hornell. Five former HHS athletes were announced Friday evening at halftime during the HHS football game. The new inductees are athletes Nick Ripple '00, Sam Stonerock '11, Julian Reinhart '13, Richie Harkenrider '13, and Jocelyn Acor '14. Established in 1988, the Hall of Fame currently boasts 211 members. Chair Tom Fagnan welcomed families and guests, and HHS alumni treasurer Angela Daniels Markel gave information on scholarships and how to become a member of the alumni. The invocation was delivered by Father Stan Kacprzak of Our Lady of the Valley and St. Ann's Church in Hornell. Mike DeGaetano presided as MC for the evening, he outlined each athlete's accomplishments, and each received a plaque acknowledging their induction.

Nick Ripple '00

Nick Ripple is a 2000 HHS graduate who competed in basketball, soccer, and track and field. He played on the JV and Varsity soccer teams for four years, and after years of playing AAU basketball in the spring, he joined Varsity track and field as a senior, where he was a frequent point contributor at meets. He placed 6th in sectionals in the triple jump and was part of a 4x100m relay team that went to the state finals.



Most of Nick's athletic success came on the hardwood where he played 3 years on the Varsity basketball team with an overall record of 48-12. After his first 2 years playing with two other hall-of-famers and 1,000-point scorers (Brian Young '98 and Kyle Johnson '99), Nick stepped into the lead role in his senior year where he averaged 20.3 points and 11.4 rebounds per game, scoring a double-double in 22 games that season. He helped take the Red Raiders to the Section V finals that year, where he was named an All-Tournament All-Star. After making the Spectator Great Eight second team as a junior, he was awarded Great Eight MVP as a senior. His dominance on the court earned him Livingston County Player of the Year honors, made the All-Leader 1st team, was invited to play in the Ronald McDonald All-Star game, and finished his career with 946 points.

After his senior year as a three-sport athlete, Nick was granted the Evening Tribune Award for Athlete of the Year for his class.

Following high school, Nick played 4 years of basketball for St. John Fisher College, starting for the Cardinals in 3 of those years and a team captain for 2. Nick resides in Lima, NY with his wife and 3 children, teaching 6th-grade science and coaching in Livonia.

Samuel Stonerock '11

Samuel Stonerock is a 2011 Hornell High School graduate who excelled in football, baseball, and track. Sam is best known for his accomplishments on the football field where he played full back, running back, and outside linebacker for the Hornell Red Raiders in 2009 and 2010.



Sam helped lead his team to two State titles in 2009 and 2010 with 13-0 undefeated seasons. Sam was awarded Livingston County All-Star 1st team in 2009 and 2010 and the Most Valuable Defensive Player award for the regional playoff game against Cheektowaga and the semi-final game against Westhill in 2009. Sam ended his 2009 season with 88 tackles and 9 sacks as an outside linebacker while running for 334 yards and 3 touchdowns as a fullback.

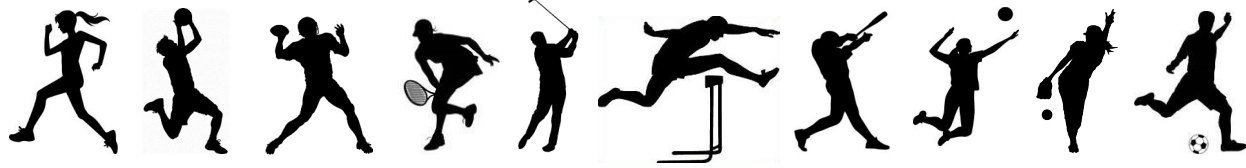
During his senior year, he was awarded 1st Team All-State, and Player of the Year awards for both sides of the football, including the Section V Defensive Player of the Year for Class B, and Offensive State Player of the Year for Class B. Sam also received Most Valuable Offensive player awards in the regional playoff game against Alden, the semi-final game against Chenango Valley, and the state championship game against Schalmont in the 2010 season. Sam also played in the Upstate vs Downstate all-star game, which was held at the Carrier Dome in Syracuse. Sam ended his 2010 season with 98 tackles, 12 sacks, and one interception as an outside linebacker, while also rushing for 2,010 yards and 30 touchdowns as a running back.

After graduation, Sam attended Morrisville State College to pursue a degree in Natural Resource Conservation and Renewable Resources. He played one year of football, starting as a running back for the Morrisville Mustangs. Sam lives in Dansville with his wife, Alexandra (Hanrahan) Stonerock, and their two children, Henry and Cali Mae. Sam is the proud owner of a local residential tree service, Stonerock Tree, LLC, servicing Hornell, Dansville, and surrounding communities.

Julian Reinhart '13

Julian Reinhart graduated from Hornell High School in 2013, earning 6 varsity letters in football and basketball.



He was a member of one Sectional Champion basketball team, three Sectional Champion football teams, two State Champion football teams, and one runner-up State Champion football team.

Julian played three years of varsity football and served as a team captain his senior year. On offense, Reinhart had 63 career receptions for 1,059 yards and 11 touchdowns. He also had 38 career rushes for 182 yards and 2 touchdowns. As a cornerback, Julian recorded 126 career tackles, and 10 interceptions with 1 being returned for a touchdown. Reinhart was named 1st Team Livingston County All-Star as a senior. He also earned Most Valuable Offensive Player of the State Quarterfinal Game and Most Valuable Defensive Player of the State Semifinal Game as a senior.

Julian played three years of varsity basketball and served as a team captain in his junior and senior years. He was a part of the Livingston County Division 1 and Section V Class B Championship team as a senior. He was named 1st Team Livingston County All-Star as a junior and senior, Spectator 8 Player of the Year as a senior, and 6th team All-State for Class B as a senior.

After high school, Julian attended Alfred University where he would continue his basketball career and major in accounting. Julian graduated in 2017 from Alfred University with a Bachelor's Degree in Accounting and in 2019 with a Master of Business Administration Focused in Accounting.

Julian is the son of Michelle and Joseph Reinhart Sr. and brother to Joseph Reinhart Jr. and Selena Maldonado. He resides in Hornell, NY, and works as a Project Control Analyst for CHBWV in West Valley, NY.

Richie Harkenrider '13

Richie Harkenrider graduated from Hornell High School in 2013, earning 8 Varsity letters in Football (3), Baseball (4), and Wrestling (1). He was a member of two Football State Championship Teams and one runner-up. He played a huge role on both sides of the ball, as both Quarterback and Defensive back. Not only did he excel in football but also in baseball, winning one sectional championship along the way. Richie was a four-year starter on the varsity baseball team.



During Richie's High School Football career, he received multiple awards and achievements. In 2011, he was awarded the Section V&VI Regional Class B Most Valuable Defensive Player. He received that same award for the NYSPHSAA Semi-Finals Class B game. He was selected as a member of the 2011 NYSSWA All-State Football, Class B second-team defense. Richie led the 2011 state championship team as a junior in multiple categories on defense. He led the team's defensive tackles (91), sacks (9), and forced fumbles (2) to help continue their historic run.

In 2012 during Richie's senior season, he received Section V Class C Most Valuable defensive back. He was selected for NYS 1st Team All-State Class C defense and LCAA Football All-Stars 1st Team. On the offensive side of the ball, Richie had a record-setting year. He achieved Hornell's single-season touchdown record with 24 touchdowns along with the single-season passing yards with 1,584 yards.

When football season was over, he made his way to the baseball diamond. Richie thrived when he was on the pitcher's mound with a career record of 12-2 with his only two losses coming as a sophomore (4-2). He was 5-0 as a junior and 3-0 as a senior with his season being cut short due to injury. He racked up a total of 131 strikeouts with an ERA of 1.17 along with two no-hitters and multiple one-hit games throughout his career. He was a member of the 2011 Section V, Class BB Championship team and was selected as a member of the 2012 LCAA Baseball All-Stars Division 1 team.

After high school, Richie continued his baseball career at the Collegiate level as a member of the 2013-2016 Cortland Red Dragons, winning a Division III National Championship with The Cortland Red Dragons in 2015.

Richie currently resides in Canisteo, NY, and is employed with Stonerock Tree Service LLC and Fresh American Hops LLC. He is the son of Bill and Nikki Harkenrider and younger brother to Zachery Harkenrider.



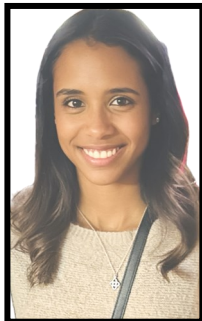

Jocelyn Acor '14

Jocelyn Acor graduated from Hornell High School in 2014. During her time at HHS, she earned 13 varsity letters in track, soccer, basketball, and one in softball. Her most notable sports are soccer and track. She was a member of 3 Section V Championship teams, one for track and two for soccer. She also earned 9 individual Section V Championships in track.



In 2010, as an 8th grader, she placed 1st in the 800-meter run at the Twin Tier Invitational. She placed 1st in the 200 and 400-meter runs at Wellsville Spring Day. She was LCAA invitational champion in the 200, 400, and 800-meter runs and was a part of the winning 1600-meter relay. She was the Class B Sectionals champion in the 400-meter dash and co-champ in the 100-meter dash. At the State Qualifier meet, she finished 1st in the 400-meter dash.

In 2011, she placed 1st in the 100, 200, and 400-meter dashes at the Twin Tier Invitational. At the Fred Stenta Invitational, she placed 1st in the 100, and 200 and was a part of the winning 400-meter relay team. At Wellsville Spring Day, she placed 1st in the 100, 200, and 400 and was also the invitational MVP. She was the LCAA invitational champion in the 100, 200, and 400-meter dashes. Jocelyn was the Class B Sectionals champion in the 100-, 200-, and 400-meter.

In 2012, at the Twin Tier Invitational, she placed 1st in the 100, 200, and 400-meter dashes. At the Hornell Invitational, she was named Meet Outstanding Performer with 1st place finishes in the 100, and 200, and was a part of the winning 400-meter relay team. At Wellsville Spring Day she placed 1st in the 100-meter dash. She was the LCAA Invitational champion in the 100 and a part of the 400-meter relay that took 1st place. Jocelyn was Class B Sectionals champion in the 100 and 200-meter dashes.

In 2014, at the Twin Tier Invitational, she placed 1st in the 100- and 200-meter dashes as well as a 1st place finish in the high jump. At the Hornell Invitational, she placed 1st in the 100 and was a part of the winning 400-meter relay. She was the Class B Sectionals champion in the 100 and 200-meter dashes. At the State Qualifier Meet, she placed 1st place in the 200-meter dash with her best State finals finish coming in her final year with 2nd place in the 200-meter dash. In 2014, she was the Section V Class B1 meet record holder in the 100-, 200-, and 400-meter dashes. She currently holds the school records in the 100 and 200-meter dashes as well as the records for the 100 and 200 at the Wellsville Spring Day Invitational.

In soccer, Jocelyn was Livingston County All-Star 1st team selection, was a 1st team All-Greater Rochester Selection 2 years in a row, and 2nd team All-State selection in 2013 when she helped her team get to the Class B New York State Semifinals. She holds the school record for most goals scored in a season at 35 goals, ending her career with a total of 79 goals. In her senior year, Jocelyn was awarded the Debbie Vanscoter Award for the top female athlete at Hornell High School. In 2020, Jocelyn was selected to the Section V Girls Soccer All-Decade team (2010-2019). Upon graduating in 2014, Jocelyn went on to attend Binghamton University where she continued playing soccer at the Division 1 level. She played in 16 games and scored 5 goals. After finishing school, Jocelyn moved back to Hornell and is currently employed by the United States Postal Service.

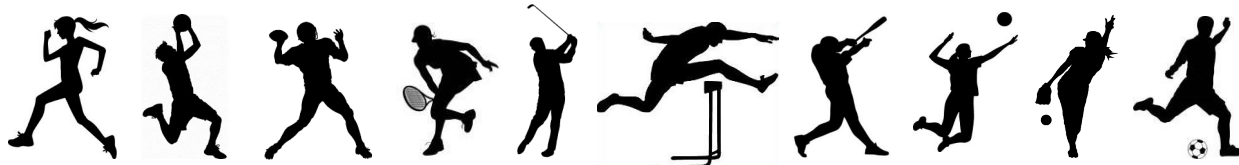

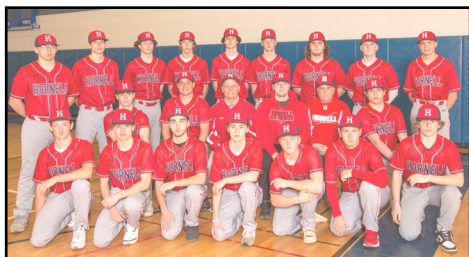
SPORTS REVIEW: 2024-2025

BOYS TRACK & FIELD



The Boys 2024 Outdoor Track and Field season was exceptional in many ways. First, it was one of the largest squads in recent years with many first-year runners, jumpers, and throwers joining a strong group of veteran athletes. Second, many individual athletes had breakout performances. Third, the team dominated several events at Sectionals, even setting a new school record. Overall, the team was 1-1-2, but could easily have been 3-1 in LCAA, Division I competition. But this squad was built for large meet and invitational competition.

Leading the way for the Red Raiders was Junior Kellen Crowe, an LCAA All-Star in the 200m, 400m, and as a member of the 400m and 1600m Relays.

He was the Wellsville Spring Day Champion in the 200m and 400m, and at the Hornell Invitational, he was 4th in the 200m. Senior Jacob Phillips was an LCAA All-Star in the 400m Hurdles and as a member of the 400m and 1600m Relays. He was the Wellsville Spring Day Champion in the 400m Hurdles and took 2nd at the Hornell Invitational as well. Jacob also won the 2024 Steven G. Terry Award for Track and Field.

Joining Jacob and Kellen as LCAA All-Stars were Xzavier Patrick, Austyn Gollnitz, and Demayne Dixon. This potent combination (combined with Jacob Phillips) were the Wellsville Spring Day 1600m Relay Champions and (with Kellen Crowe) they finished second in the 400m Relay by .04. This group also placed second at the Hornell Invitational. These All-Stars became Section V Champions as well. At the Section V, Class B2 Championships Kellen won the 200m and the 400m and Jacob Phillips took the 400m Hurdle crown. These two earned sectional patches, along with their teammates, Xzavier Patrick, Austyn Gollnitz, and Demayne Dixon were also the 400m and 1600m Relay Champions. The 400m Relay also broke the 40-year-old school record at Sectionals. Overall, the Boys' team finished tied for 5th at Sectionals out of 15 teams. And these same five standout athletes also advanced to the Section V State Qualifier Meet.

Losing Jacob and Xzavier will leave two big gaps to fill, but an emerging group of underclassmen, including Skyler Aldrich, Trayvon Heckman, Jayden Rasphei, Cole Hopper, and Ayden Travis are eager to step up in 2025.

TENNIS

The Hornell Varsity Tennis Team finished the season with a 4-7 record. Despite a slow start, they won three of their final four matches before narrowly losing to Haverling in the sectional tournament. With a young team and only one senior in the top seven, the tennis team aims to carry the momentum from the end of the season into the next, expecting even greater success.

Underclassmen Ryan McLaughlin, Amaury Fleury, Will Murphy, and Davvyn Thompson all competed in the individual sectionals tournament in Palmyra Macedon. With a high number of returning players and the addition of new courts at HHS, the tennis program in Hornell looks forward to a bright future.





GIRLS TRACK & FIELD



The Varsity girls had an outstanding season this year. We had a lot of very young athletes, but that didn't stop them from being fierce competitors. With many new faces to the program this year, this was one of the bigger teams we've had in quite a while. The team went 2-2 in dual meets for the Livingston County League, however, the large Invationals are where they shined. The girls dominated the competition and won both the Hornell Invitational and the Wellsville Spring Day meet. They were also the Section V Class B2 runners-up.

One of our premier athletes was freshman Ella White. She was an LCAA All-Star in the 100m dash and the 100 Hurdles. She did a myriad of events throughout the season and was a powerhouse at everything she tried, but ultimately stuck with the ones she loved the most. She was an integral part of both the 4x100 and 4x400 relays. She was the Hornell Invitational Champion in the 100-meter dash and placed 2nd for the 100 Hurdles. Pairing those wins with the incredible legs of the 4x100 and 4x400 relays, she was named Female Track Athlete of the Meet. She was also the Wellsville Spring Day Champion for the 100m and as a member of the 4x100 relay. She was the 100m Champion at the League Championships, and Sectional Champion in the 100m and 100m Hurdles, earning herself 2 Sectional patches, as well as a member of the 2nd place 4x100 team. She finished the season ranked as the top runner for the 100m in the Livingston County League and 4th in Section V Class B2.

Another top dog, Sophomore Selena Maldonado, was an LCAA All-Star in the 200m dash and Triple Jump. Selena was a triple champion at the Hornell Invitational in the 200m, Long Jump, and Triple Jump, which earned her the title of Female Track MVP of the meet. She was the Wellsville Spring Day Champion, LCAA Champion, and Sectional Champion in the 200m, as well as placed 3rd at the State Qualifier meet. Selena was also the anchor for the 4x100 relay in the last 3 meets of the season. She finished the season 2nd in LCAA and 4th in Section V Class B2 in the 200m and 2nd in LCAA for Triple Jump. Joining Ella and Selena as LCAA All-Stars were Madison Rudenauer in the 400m Hurdles and Elisa Bodin in the 3000m. Madison finished 4th in the 400 Hurdles at Wellsville Spring Day, 3rd at LCAA Championships, and 2nd at Sectionals. Elisa finished 2nd in the 3000m at the Hornell Invite, 4th at the LCAA Championships, 3rd at Sectionals, and 4th at State Qualifiers. She also placed 5th in the 1500m at Sectionals.

8th grader Delainey Thompson was the LCAA Champion in the High Jump, as well as tied for 4th at Sectionals. Silvia Carretto in the 800m and Parker Graham in the 400m Hurdles both placed 3rd in Sectionals.

The 4x100 relay team consisting of Riley Harwood, Marianne Colson, Delainey Thompson, and Ella White placed 2nd at the Hornell Invitational and were the Wellsville Spring Day Champions. Selena Maldonado replaced Delainey for the remainder of the season where they placed 2nd at the LCAA Championship and 2nd at Sectionals, where they ran just .05 seconds behind the 1st place team, and are just .26 seconds off of the school record.

The 4x400 team of Madison Rudenauer, Parker Graham, Ella White, and Silvia Carretto were the Hornell Invite Champions. They took 2nd at Wellsville Spring Day. With Delainey Thompson replacing Ella White due to injury, they won at the LCAA Championships. They also took 3rd in Sectionals.

All nine girls mentioned above advanced to the Section V State Qualifier Meet. Even though she didn't win at State Quals, Ella White's best time of 12.39 seconds in the 100m met the State Super Standard and secured her a spot at the State Championship Meet in Cicero, NY.

We will be losing Seniors Norah Foreman, Kadience Gollnitz, and Abby O'Donaghue. This was the first year for both Kadience and Abby, and they both stepped up and did a great job this season. The remaining athletes are already locked in for next year and determined to break some records.

FOOTBALL



"The best-laid plans of mice and men oft go awry" is the best way to describe the beginning of the 2024 season. The start was full of challenges, ups and downs to say the least. These young men came together persevered and learned the valuable lesson of choices. When one is knocked down there are two choices: to stay down or to get back up. Though the season ended in the semis finishing with a 4-5 record these young men moved the needle in the right direction as the program continues to make moves to return to where it belongs. Along the way 2024 also saw the program take in student-athletes from Arkport-Canaseraga a huge milestone for all three communities, we are indebted to all three school districts, the brotherhood of Hornell Football continues, and we look forward to the future to build off of what the 2024 team accomplished.

BOYS BASKETBALL



The 2024-25 basketball team finished with a record of 14-8. The team won the LCAA Division I Championship with an 8-0 record. This marks the 3rd straight year of winning the league and 24 straight victories against league opponents. The team had some great wins during the year, such as beating B2 #1 seed Avon at home, beating the C2 sectional champion York, Class A Rochester Prep, and a sectional victory over rival Wellsville in the quarterfinal. In sectionals, we lost in the semifinals to the eventual champion World of Inquiry.

The team was led by its four senior captains PJ Picco, Austyn Gollnitz, Aaron McInerney, and Quinn Mauro. Junior starters Wyatt Evingham and Demayne Dixon both played big roles on the team as the starting backcourt.

PJ finished off a great four-year career by leading the Red Raiders in almost every statistical category. He led the team in points, assists, rebounds, and steals. In sectionals, he was able to secure his 1,000th career point with just a minute to go in his high school career. He is only the 5th Red Raider in school history to accomplish the feat.

Next year the team will bring back nine players to the varsity team. We are looking forward to the future and hope to build upon what this year's team has accomplished.

MAPLE CITY MILESTONES



St. Ann's Church Organists Retire

With the retirements of our two very dedicated organists, the clergy and parishioners of Our Lady of the Valley Parish in Hornell, NY share the following in tribute to their dedication to the parish.

Bill Loree '54 has graciously shared his musical talents with the Hornell and surrounding communities over the past 70-plus years. Bill recently retired as a volunteer organist for Our Lady of the Valley Parish at the end of August 2024. He had been the organist who played regularly at St. Ann's Church, of Our Lady of the Valley Parish, for the 4:30 Saturday Mass. Bill shared he feels blessed by God to have been given his musical talent and always felt it was his duty to share that music with others.



Bill Loree '54

Bill attended St. Ann's School in Hornell and is a 1954 graduate of Hornell High School. His wife Joan Murphy Loree is a 1953 graduate of Hornell High School. He earned his BS in Education from SUNY Geneseo in 1960. In 1964, he earned his master's degree from New York University. During his 31 years of service in the Hornell School System, he served as a teacher, elementary guidance counselor, and principal at one time or another of all six elementary schools.

Bill has always had a love for music. He shared that he was around 3 years old when one Sunday he sat down at the piano and began playing hymns he had heard at church. Bill took piano lessons at St. Ann's School and played for various school events and activities. He began playing the organ at St. Ignatius Church when he was only 11 years old. Bill began playing the piano on weekends in 1961 at the former Sherwood Hotel in Hornell.

Bill has also shared his musical talents with so many sing-a-longs at the Big Elms, Knights of Columbus, Hornell Country Club, and Club 57 over the years. He was given the nickname "Broadway Bill Loree" and "Hornell's Piano Man" by many in past years. Bill was the Church Organist and Choir Director at St. Ignatius Church and then continued as a volunteer organist at St. Ann's Church when the area Catholic churches formed Our Lady of the Valley Parish in 2004. He has also played and provided music at the former St. Joachim's Church in Canisteo, as well as at St. Mary's Church in Rexville—which remains part of Our Lady of the Valley Parish. Throughout his life, Bill has shared his musical talents and provided so many people with joyous celebrations at weddings and holiday celebrations, as well as providing music for funerals and mass celebrations.

The organ at St. Ann's Church of Our Lady of the Valley Parish was built in approximately 1881 and came to the parish around 1888. It was constructed in Buffalo by "Garrett House." It was electrified in 1951 and changed to a solid state by John Bartell in 1988. It took an entire year to make this adjustment.

John Bartell said he first inquired about playing the organ on Christmas day because, in the mid-1950s, music was provided for St. Ann's midnight Mass but not for daytime Christmas liturgies. He was permitted to play during the daytime Christmas masses and hasn't stopped since.

John Bartell played the organ in Oneonta before he came to Hornell and graduated from Hornell High School in 1958. In the past, John could even be seen from time to time mowing the lawn for the church. Before retiring, John played the organ at two Sunday Masses each month for Our Lady of the Valley Parish. He also played as needed for funerals and holy day of obligation masses. John's wife Nancy predeceased him after 51 years of marriage. They are the parents of 3 Hornell graduates: Kevin '88, Mary '89, and Patrice '97.

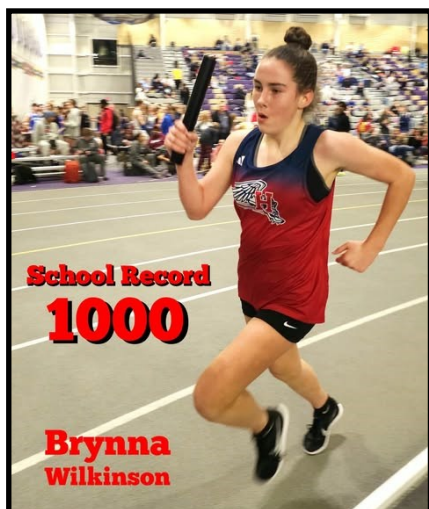
Breaking Records Left and Right!

Chief Operator Lenny Fucci noted the significant effort required to achieve this certification. "Receiving this license is no easy feat," Fucci said. "Operators must work in a WTP for at least one year, complete 180 hours of coursework, and pass a rigorous exam administered by the New York State Department of Health (DOH). Caleb has excelled in learning the intricate testing and monitoring procedures we use to ensure residents receive high-quality water."

Fucci further praised Mitchell's commitment, adding, "Caleb has worked to master the best practices, not just for our plant, but for any water treatment plant. He completed over a year of coursework through [University of Sacramento] before being able to sit for his exam. The DOH was on site to perform the evaluation, and we are pleased and proud of Caleb for earning his 2A license."

Hornell Humane Society – Renovations & Expansion – Ribbon Cutting Ceremony

Since its inception in 1906, the Hornell Area Humane Society (HAHS) has met the needs of the animals they serve. However, over the years, the Humane Society has found struggles in meeting the increased needs of the animals they serve, with the most pressing barrier being actual space. A few years ago, this need was recognized by HAHS leadership, leading to applying for funding through the NYS Animal Capital Fund. HAHS put in a strong bid with the hope of obtaining funding for additional dog suites, expansion of existing kennels, and upgrades to the shelter's cattery.

A major contributor to this initiative was the late Patty "Tiger" Mehlenbacher Moore, HHS Class of 1978. Patty always had a love for animals, especially dogs; she always owned Labradors. Along with being an HHS graduate, after college, "Mrs. Moore" came back to Hornell and started her 30-year career as a first-grade teacher for the Hornell City School District (teaching at the former Bryant School and North Hornell School). When retiring in 2016, Patty connected with HAHS as a volunteer and was able to spread her love for all the shelter's animals. Eventually, Patty joined the HAHS Board of Directors, ultimately becoming the President of the HAHS Board of Directors. Patty spent countless hours volunteering and advocating for HAHS. Sadly, after a yearlong battle with COVID, Patty ended up passing away due to complications from COVID in December 2021. However, this did not stop HAHS from moving forward with its NYS Grant, and eventually, in April 2022, HAHS was awarded the NYS matching grant. With this grant came the need for the shelter to match the funds awarded by NYS.

In typical Hornell fashion, the community stepped up and delivered the matching funds. Patty's family and friends made a major contribution in Patty's honor, as we all know this would have followed Patty's wishes. From beginning to end, construction at the shelter progressed quickly. Finally, on December 5, 2024, the shelter hosted a formal Ribbon Cutting Ceremony. The event was well attended by many in the community. Patty's legacy was embedded in this construction, with the dog suite named in her honor; along with a plaque and a statue of St. Francis of Assisi (patron saint of animals). With construction completed, HAHS now has much more room and facility enhancements to meet the increased needs of the animals they serve. McLaughlin Earns Plant Operators License

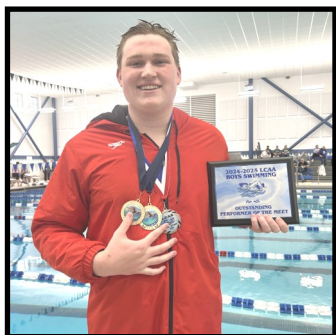
Robert McLaughlin was recognized at the February Board of Public Works meeting for earning his 4A Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator license. McLaughlin, a 20-year employee of the City of Hornell's Water Pollution Control Plant (WPCP), has achieved the highest level of certification currently offered by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC). This certification is required to oversee a facility as complex as Hornell's wastewater treatment plant.

It was noted that the path to becoming a chief operator of a 4A plant is a long one that can take many years to complete. Operators must meet extensive requirements, including education, experience, specialized training, and laboratory proficiency. Additionally, they must pass an ABC board certification exam and demonstrate their ability to perform lab testing, interpret data, and make operational adjustments to ensure the highest quality effluent is released into the Canisteo River. The 4A certification exam is widely regarded as one of the most challenging in the field, with a 75% failure rate.

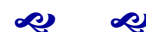

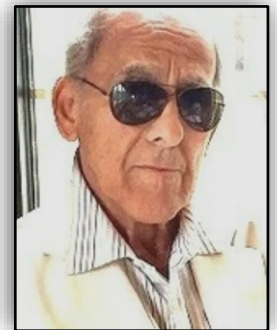
Richard Anthony "Rich" Argentieri '50

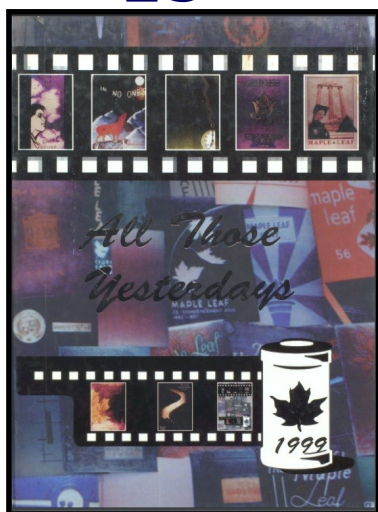

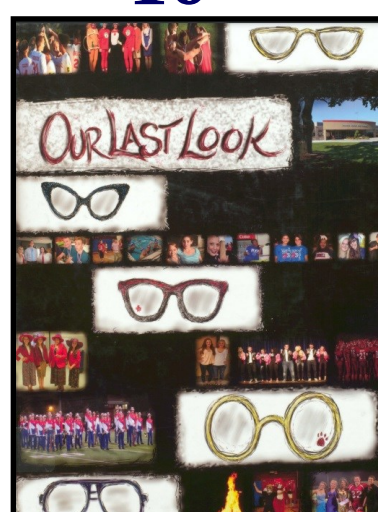
